VILLAGE NOTES. Recently, a number of crows, a fox, and a pigeon have been found dead in Braunston. They were victims of someone who had put down poisoned meat. Crows and foxes may be disliked by poultry keepers and other people for various reasons, but to scatter poisoned bait where any animal or bird can pick it up is an act of criminal stupidity.

Our wild life is under heavy pressure - more land taken for houses and factories leaves less living space, and so we ought to make things easier for our birds and animals still free.

One observer studying the activities of adult birds in a rookery during the season when they were rearing their young calculated that the birds ate half a ton of grubs and caterpillars each day. As a caterpillar eats ten or three times its own weight of food each day the amount of vegetables saved by the birds must amount to twice that amount. We can therefore be sure that crows and rooks more than pay for the food which they consume.
