BREATH IN BLOOM COMPETITION. Braunston has again been successful in reaching the English finals of the Village Section of this competition.

Judging will take place during the first two weeks of August. Aspects to which the judges pay particular regard are:- Obvious involvement of the whole community, cleanliness, floral decoration of business premises, appearance of approaches to the Parish, well kept and tasteful front gardens, and the appearance of open plan, and inevitably, ABSENCE OF LITTER. Please let us see if we can go a stage further THIS YEAR.

VILLAGE NOTES. During the past few weeks the roadsides and the canal paths have been swarm with a profuse growth of Chervil, popularly known as Lady's Lace, which has often been used like Gypsophila, to set off bunches of sweet peas etc. The cessation of spraying of verges has encouraged the growth of other plants, hedges and garlic mustard, providing food for the caterpillars of the dainty Orange Tip butterflies which are flying now. Twenty years ago we had 25 varieties of butterfly and 50 varieties of moth in this area but few have survived. In our gardens we can see the Cinnabar Moth, with its bright red wings. The Caterpillar feeds on groundsel and ragwort. Most caterpillars match their colours with their background as a protection. The caterpillar of the Cinnabar moth adopts conspicuous colours - red and orange transverse bands, warning birds that they are not pleasant food, and a bird only eats one at his peril.
