VILLAGE NOTES. Some years ago it was suggested that if Gulls came inland, this was a sign of stormy conditions at sea. However, many Gulls now settle beside inland waters, nesting and rearing their chicks on the banks.

In Braunston we are favoured by the presence of Black-headed Gulls (the heads are really a dark chocolate brown) which recently have stood on the banks of the canal, too floating on the canal. They are looking for food, which might float or swim in the water.

At present there is no dark colouring of the head as this only appears in the summer months, when breeding is in progress. Small dark spots appear on the face but to the practised eye there are sufficient marks to identify the latter species.
