VILLAGE NOTES. Perhaps the mild weather of this winter has encouraged extra activities among the moles. In Fawsley Park, on either side of the lake and in other neighbouring areas, moles appear to have been abnormally busy - the numerous small mounds of earth bear witness to this.

The mole is an example of an animal adapting itself to circumstances in which its life is passed. The cylindrical body is fitted for moving through tunnels, and the paws - like shovels at the end of a very short and powerful fore and rear limbs, are excellent tools adapted to press the soil into the sides of its tunnels.

The velvet fur coat is unlike that of a cat or dog in that it is unaffected whichever way it is rubbed. This is a useful characterisation of an animal which may wish to move either forward to backward when it cannot turn round. Sight is of little use to an animal whose life is spent almost entirely underground, and so the eyes are almost useless. However, the senses of hearing and touch are very highly developed.
