VILLIAGE NOTES. A stone wall or rock is an unlikely place to find interesting plant life, as in a prolonged dry spell most plants in such a situation would so lack moisture as to perish. Yet lichens grow, survive and flourish there. They may be grey, green or, like some specimens, be a brilliant; ow. The lichen is really a composite of two plants - Algae (one celled green plants) live alongside fungi. The fungus supplies nitrogenous products and the green algae containing chlorophyll supplies the fungus with organic food. This is an example of a form of living called symbiosis (two Greek words meaning "living together").
