VILLAGE NOTES. One of the most highly coloured birds in our neighbourhood is the Yellowhammer, which at first glance might be taken for a canary. The male has a bright yellow chest, a chestnut brown back, and white feathers in its tail. The female's colour is a rather duller yellow. The bird, about the size of a sparrow, has the short sturdy bill characteristic of seed eating birds. During the breeding season the birds remain closely united with their family, but in Autumn they join the flocks of their own kind and often join with birds of similar size, in foraging for food in fields and hedgerows. Some Yellowhammers come from regions with winter climates more harsh than our own. All birds have distinctive calls, the Yellowhammer two distinct ones - when flying it calls "tweet tweet", but when perched in a bush or on a gate post its cry is "A little bit of bread and NO cheese" - the last word being drawn out for a second or two.
