VILLAGE NOTES Rainfall for September 24 mm of which 21.7 mm fell on 13th Sep. October to 21st 27.7 mm.

Thanks to the canal holiday traffic our village has become a tourist attraction to visitors of various nationalities, enjoying the tranquillity of the countryside. Many of those remark on how interesting and pleasant a place it is. Much of this is due to the expenditure of cash, time and effort by those whose gardens adjoin the highway. It is very distasteful to say that one lady's efforts to improve her front garden were thwarted by some misguided persons who uprooted newly planted trees, and allowed their dogs to rampage over her carefully cultivated front.

A little consideration for the feelings of others and a pride in their own village should prevent this stupid behaviour in future.

1986 could well be termed the Year of the Belated Summer. For part of September and October the summer-like conditions have brought beautiful butterflies and those who are fortunate enough to have a late flowering Buddleia have seen, Brimstones, Red Admirals, Peacocks, Painted Ladies, Tortoiseshells, Speckled Woods as well as the very unwelcome Cabbage Whites.

Incidentally if anyone should see the body of a caterpillar surrounded by some lemon yellow cocoons, remember that these are the pupae of the Ichneumon Fly of which the larvae feed on the caterpillars of the Cabbage White Butterfly, so are friends of the gardener.
