ACTION RESEARCH FOR THE CRIPPLED CHILD On September 9th Mrs. Jill Lee of Carvells gave a very interesting and enjoyable demonstration of Microwave Cookery. The sum of £88.40 was raised. Many thanks to all who supported this event.

Dog owners are asked not to allow their dogs to use the playing fields as a dogs to ilet as this creates a nuisance to children and adults playing there, and if people would remove their litter the fields would be more attractive.

Many people, especially town dwellers, regard starlings as an unmitigated nuisance when they congregate on a site chosen for their night roosting place if this happens to be a building with ledges inaccessible to cleaners. Yet these birds are able to maintain a complicated life style.

A flock of these birds flying in vast numbers can wheel to right or left without a single collision. To organize a similar flight of ten aircraft would require an elaborate signalling system.

At this time of the year small flocks fly to their particular feeding grounds where they search fields for insects or fruit. They will then in the evening gather in their groups in a tree or on a rooftop and then take off in a body for the roosting place. At this point they will descend in tens of thousands, chatter for some time and settle down in the darkness. Their huge numbers give them protection against predators.

Later this year we shall have an invasion by starlings escaping from countries in Europe with more severe winter conditions than our own.

Perhaps we have something to learn from these birds - how they organize their lives to afford co-operation and mutual dependence as well as solving some of Rainfall: August 120 mm. and September to 21st 23.9 mm
