VILLAGE NOTES

In the 17th Century a Swedish botanist - Carl Linnaeus classified plants and animals in such a way that his system with minor modifications is accepted today. Plants he divided into flowering and non-flowering varieties according to their productive mechanism.

However, the development of the compound microscope has shown that the difference in the reproductive processes between the varieties is much less than Linnaeus thought. Several non-flowering plants such as mosses and lichens add to the beauty of our countryside by hollowing the appearance of rocks and houses.

A moss on a rock face can endure intense winter frost, or scorching heat in summer, which other cultivated plants could never endure, and then return to normal life when the weather improves.

At present the mosses are a delightful green as they decorate the walls.
