Recently some households in the Village have suffered the misfortune of a visit from a burglar. For the people concerned this is an extremely unpleasant experience and it is the duty of us all to try to prevent its recurrence. This requires vigilance from us all. Large scale robberies may require elaborate planning but many small scale thefts are encouraged when people neglect ordinary precautions, for example very expensive bikes are left lying by the gate or garden wall. What would be easier for a thief than to pick it up, or expensive clothes to be taken from a line in the garden. An unlocked car with a valuable coat or bag of groceries left unattended presents the thief with a golden opportunity. Observing a few precautions will save much heartache.
