The lengthening of the hours of daylight, the feeling of slight warmth in the sunlight give a more cheerful outlook than we have known since Nevember. The birds singing and their kusying themselves with nest building make us realize that Spring is on its way. The law now, quite rightly, forbids the practice of the days of our youth, collecting eggs of wild birds and interest in living birds has grown. Each variety of bird has its own method of nest construction, Ages ago birds has rewarded the art of heat conservation. The thrush's bowl of dried clay is wrapped in a skilfully woven blanket of hay or straw. The chaffinch carefully lines its nest with wool or feathers and produces a mesterplace of construction wonderfully nest. The nests of crows, rooks and magpies are built as platforms of sticks fastened so that they may be possed in a wind but not breken. The loss of cur elm trees must have been a wornying factor in their choice of sites but they have used other trees. We have still much to learn from the birds.
