VILLAGE NOTES Our fairly mild if somewhat rainy January (98.2 mms rain) was followed by a mild February (30.6mms rain) have encouraged the Spring flowers to blossom much earlier than we could normally expect. Snowdrops, crocuses, daffodils, flowering cherry and even tulips have flowered, and among the wild flowers primroses, lesser celandines, chickweed, groundsel, violet blackthorn have flowered.

One insect which seems to defy all our expectations is the midge. It seems to have nothing with which it can withstand the cold but it has already appeared. Soon we will have the spawn in the ponds. Already rooks have been busy building nests. The loss of the elms must have been a disappointment for them, but they have quickly adapted to other trees. The blackbirds and thrushes will be building their homes. While many of the traditional building sites are being swallowed up in building developments we still have a never ending scene to observe. Many gardeners are fortunate to have a friendly robin who will follow them round as they turn up a spadeful of soil where he can pick up some morsel of food.
