but much of the pleasure we see in viewing our hills and even old walls and buildings is due to the flowerless plants. These include ferns, algae, liverworts and mosses. Many of our mosses give a covering to rocks and walls, colouring what might appear as uninteresting masses. It is a never-ending wonder that they survive in what must seem such unfriendly places. They are exposed to bitter cold in winter and in summer the scorching heat (when we have it) no visible supply of water or anything resembling shade. Yet these plants grow and flourish and reproduce themselves in spite of all the adverse conditions. If we observe a patch of moss at times it produces spore cases resembling tiny golf sticks. It is in these cases that the spores develop. Green at first they become brown and develop a cunningly designed lid composed of triangular sections broadly based at the

circumference and tapering to a point at the centre of the capsule. These are very sensitive to moisture. In damp conditions these segments close to give a waterproof cover opening again when dry conditions prevail and spores are released to float free in the wind for distribution.
