ERNEST CLARKE What does one say about 'Ernie', all of us who have any connections with our Parish Church will have come into contact with him. When he took a job on it would get done - all be it - in his own time and in his own way of doing things. He took over as verger & sexton from Geo. Manning (senior) and was paid a very small gratuity for all his duties - he would never accept an increase from the FCC - it was, he said, his contribution to the Stewardship of the Church. When he was in business his main priority in the winter was keeping the valley and gullies on the church roof free of ice and snow. It was through his efforts that our church roof is in such good condition today. Many people have benefitted from his acts of kindness and caring done in a very quiet way. Ernie was our grave digger for very many years - a job which he did 'right' and with great pride - one of his frequent sayings being 'they're all the same when they come down here'.. He had problems with his poor old knees in the last two or three years of his life and around last Christmas-time began to show signs of the pain he was to suffer to the end of his life. He is at rest now - Goodbye to a friend and fellow church worker.
