I don't think that anyone writing at this time can avoid saying something about the conflict in The Persian Gulf. And that is especially difficult as we have no idea what will be the state of affairs when this Newsletter is delivered.

On the day that the United Nations coalition commenced the current attack against the Iraqi occupation of Kuwait, Wendy and I were at Vimy Ridge contemplating the human cost and futility of war; not the futility of those whose lives dearly bought the fragile peace of 1918, their bravery is their everlasting memorial, but the futility of war as an agent of international relations. Yet, here we are again, locked in another war, maybe of a different nature fought with different weapons, but a war just the same. That we have to resort to war is a failure by the whole of humanity, its institutions, its religions its purpose. We have learned, this century, that there are forces of evil which cannot be stopped in any other way than by force, but this must be a last resort. For those who believe in peace and justice, this is a very sad time. What can we do, in Braunston? Pray, now, for the world and resolve to work actively for peace and international understanding, when the conflict is over.

February 13th. sees the start of Lent; a time of the year when we look forward to the Spring and re-awakening of countryside and garden. In our spiritual lives the Church looks forward and its members prepare themselves to celebrate the great re-awakening in the Resurrection of Easter. This year, as a part of that preparation, we are having a Study Group to look at some of the fundamentals of our Faith, but the true preparation will be in our own hearts, where we look for some of the causes of (and our own involvement in) the ravages of sin and war in the world. We pray that where we find ourselves in error we may actively work for reconciliation. Goodness and Peace can only be victorious in the world through the goodwill of mankind; we believe that the Holy Spirit of God drives us in that direction.

VILLAGE NOTES The Garden in February - by Frank Cox

Although February is often a bitterly cold month there are already signs of the coming Spring. It is perhaps a time to be concentrating on those jobs which need to be completed before the main growing season starts.

Where the ground is suitable and not waterlogged, digging and manuring of sites for sowing annuals and biennials can be completed. Ground dug in the Autumn can be lightly forked over. Seeds of half-hardy annuals can be sown in a cold frame or greenhouse towards the end of the month. Remove any dead stems from perennials before the young shoots begin to grow, and fork over the soil between plants. New plants can still be planted and older over-crowded ones divided.

Turf-laying for lawns should be completed by the end of the month. Aerate established lawns and if worm casts are a nuisance scatter them on dry days with a birch broom. Treat with moss-killing compounds if necessary.

Where climbing and rambling roses have made a great deal of growth in the latter part of last year selected shoots can be tied up to the wall or other supports and the rest pruned off.

Routine pruning of established fruit trees should be finished now and prunings burnt.

Autumn-fruiting raspberry canes should be cut to the ground and the summer-fruiting varieties cut back to a bud just above the top wire.
