Village Notes by Dick Herne

Castle House and the adjacent cottage are distinctive buildings in the High Street.

The house with three storeys probably derives its name from its height.

On its west side there are traces of the gable end of an older cottage.

According to the 1851 census Castle house was occupied by Mr Cattell who kept a chemists shop in the cottage. His son became a fully qualified doctor with the degrees of 'M.D.' and 'M.R.C.S.'

He lived in the house behind the present Post Office.

Harrow Lane takes its name from the stone house to the west; in 1851 it was a public house. A little further on is the Old Plough, a traditional building which has been refaced and enlarged by the addition of an extra storey. Next to it is a modern house which has replaced the old thatched cottage shown in early photographs of the village
