windows give light to the upstairs rooms but originally the house was an open hall. It had a central hearth with a massive stone chimney facing the front door. To the right the door was a small opening - now blocked up - which provided draught to keep the fire burning. The attractive trellised porch with iron supports is a later edition to the house, similar to one further down the High Street. The name of the house next door Hewitts Barn - indicates the former use of the site. Broadlands - No. 62 High Street - is one of the largest of the older village houses and a good example of traditional stone building. It has a typical steep pitched roof to enable rainwater to run off. Modern tiles have replaced the former thatch. New dormer To the right of
