history. The small window to the east of the present shop front belonged to the original grocery shop. Mr Gurney also owned a small boutique in a house that was formerly occupied by a bank, next door to Elgin House. In between the two shops was another building which at one time was one of the many public houses in Braunston-The Cross Guns. Subsequently, it became a butchers, then a Village Notes-Dick Herne.

A name familiar to all who live in Braunston is 'Gurneys', and their premises have had quite a varied greengrocers, and finally a betting office. The building was pulled down, and the modern store was built in 1973

Village Appraisal: 65% of village homes returned appraisal forms. A report with the data has been prepared for retention in Village Library, with copies to the Parish and other Councils.
