WILLAGE NOTES by Dick Herne
The present Post Office shop partly obscures the handsome 18th century house behind it. Before this became the postmaster's residence it had a varied history. Originally it was a farmhouse built about 1700 and subsequently belonged to a local doctor. Later the Poor Law Guardians turned it into a Children's home; a cottage behind it in the 'back lane' (Church Road) was used as an isolation ward for children with infectious diseases. The home passed from the Guardians into the hands of the County Council. Finally it was bought by Mr. A.W. Turner who opened a shop in 1935 and added the Post Office in 1938. The Post Office had previously been located in several different places - at Waite's house (21 High St.) The Shambles, and Pebody's on the Green.
The building next to the P.O., formerly a Co-operative Store, was once a small factory making candles. Further on there was a works where long ropes were made by hand for use in hauling canal boats.
