Jetty Field: Braunston Conservation Group stands

There is a field on the South of our village that/at the crossing point of many pathways used by our people. The small area of woodland at the top of the field is part of the old garden of this house and the older trees are mainly ornamental; the new plantings are of native trees. But the most precious heritage of this field lies in the very grass sward beneath our fiect. For this meadow is rich in a great variety of grasses. The field has always been farmed in the best of traditional ways and the plants have not been thinned out by chamical weedkillers or fertilizers.
