

VILLAGE HALL NEWS -

PHASE 2 -**CLOSE TO COMPLETION**

At the time of writing, the Village Hall is 3 weeks away from the intended completion date, and there have been few problems to report. The Games Room floor was excavated to a depth of about 2 foot, and a new concrete floor,

insulation, under floor heating and a top screed are in place. The screed needs quite a long time to dry out, and it is therefore unwise to lay a new vinyl. We have therefore decided to lay a cheap carpet, and put down the new vinyl in about 6 - 9 months time.

With the Hall and Games Room now level, and the wooden sliding doors removed, there is a great feeling of space that will work well for large events.

There is still much work to do - ceilings and walls to plaster, cupboards to build, new doors to be fitted, a new kitchen to be installed, plus new heating, and decoration - but hopefully the builders will be able to keep to their schedule and the hall will re-open early in September.

Sadly, we have not yet been unable to replace the curtains in the Main Hall which will be a disappointment to most users. The 30 year old orange curtains will have to be re-hung until we see how much money is left after all the bills are in.

The 1st opportunity that many of you will have to see the improvements should be the Fruit, Flower and Vegetable Show on Saturday, September 11th, opening at 2.00 p.m.


