Churchyard trees

Thank you to all those who have offered to donate yew trees for the Churchyard, a source of good quality 5 foot, pot grown trees has now been found and we await formal permission from the Church Authorities to plant them in the Autumn. All donors will be contacted nearer the time to make the final arrangements. Many villagers have offered the Parish Council seedling yew trees and we hope to be able to use these for screening the new central heating fuel tank, soon to be installed in the Churchyard.

Highway matters

We recently received a written undertaking from Councillor Jim Wade, the County Council Member for Sustainability, that the potholes in Dark Lane would be filled. High Street and part of Welton Road are to be 'considered for a possible resurfacing scheme'. In Church Road, remedial work is to be carried out on identified potholes and subsidence to the footpath. Some kerb entry gullies are to be reset. Councillor Wade has said that he 'will arrange for temporary repairs to be made to keep the area in a safe condition' and that 'The street will then be reassessed for permanent repairs during the service inspection in December 2004'.

Nine new households

Our congratulations and good wishes to all the young Braunston people who, as a result of the Parish Council Housing Needs Survey, were lucky enough to be housed in the new 'Eastfields' development. We wish them every happiness in their new homes. As a result of the 106 legal agreement, made at the request of the Parish Council, as a condition of planning permission for the site, the nine houses will be for Braunston people only in perpetuity.

Police matters

On March 11th a special meeting was held with Chief Superintendent John Miller, to discuss particular problems that are being experienced in the village. We have his assurance that these matters will be dealt with and we look forward to better cooperation and a more active police presence in the future. In the meantime, please continue to send details of any problems you have encountered to Steve Rolt, so that your complaints can be logged and we can assess if effective action has been taken.

Neighbourhood Watch

Whilst many public spirited people are reporting suspicious incidents in the parish, it would be a great help if the once thriving Neighbourhood Watch scheme, could be re established. This in turn would bring in more police support and would take the responsibility away from individuals. Can You Help? 
Police 'Surgery' to resume


