
Our grateful thanks to Jean, we shall ensure that her gift will provide a fitting tribute to her parents.

Daventry is our local town and it is about to expand. This does not just mean more houses, there is a commitment to make radical changes to the town, bringing in the infrastructure to cater for peoples needs as the town grows over the next 20 years and beyond. New businesses, car parks, shops, leisure facilities and public open spaces are envisaged.

This is your chance to have your say, you have until March 15th to look at the plans and make your views known. If you would like to see more facilities for youngsters, sports facilities, a cinema or theatre, water park, good restaurants, a modern museum and art gallery etc, say so now. Who knows, your wildest dream could be somebody else's too and it could become reality. Daventry Town Centre Vision plans can be seen at the Council Offices and Daventry Library. A copy of the full document can be viewed by appointment at 34 High Street and The Old Forge, questionnaires are also available for you to fill in. All responses should be sent to: The Civic Trust, Winchester House, 259-269 Old Marylebone Road, London NW1 5RA, to reach there by March 15th.

Appeal Dismissed

Barclays Bank's proposals to build 29 properties on the site of the old station yard were derailed after a 2 day Planning Appeal in January. Barclays had appealed against the District Council's decision to refuse planning permission but after the hearing the Government Inspector found that 'The proposals involve serious and considerable breaches of the intentions of key planning policies in the adopted Local and Structure Plans'. The Parish Council has for many years tried to obtain the site for the village and plans to work with the Woodland Trust in a 'Millennium Wood' scheme had to be put on hold because of Barclays' planning applications. It is hoped that the area, which is important to wildlife, can now be obtained for the village and properly maintained.



Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

Someone from my old College was reporting back from a Kigali Jail in Rwanda where 1000's of prisoners were awaiting trial for the atrocities of the genocide of 1994. He went to address the morning service. As he turned the corner 2000 were in the congregation! Some were asking for forgiveness from the families of the victims they had killed and conversely some families were forgiving the murderers of their sons and daughters. The Gospel had power to transform lives.

David Watson said this about the Church; 'The Christian gospel is not about superstars, but about God's extraordinary grace in spite of very human faults and failure.'

In quiet moments we realize we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves. Though made in God's image we have a tendency to want things now, to try and look after no.1. Lent is a time when we are aware of our humanity - our wonderfulness and our shame. Jesus didn't come to condemn us and tell us how naughty we are. He came to save and affirm. He didn't give into temptation in the wilderness, he showed humility and he made the ultimate sacrifice. As we meditate on the cross we see what this cost him. He did it because he loves us. Lent is not so much about abstinence as hearing again and again of his love. He still loves you and me. He still forgives you and me. It's an old story but if you allow the message to sink in it is transforming.

Could you benefit from Brushes and Spades?

Daventry Volunteer Centre's 'Brushes and Spades' Project.

Every year this project offers decorating or gardening help to elderly or disabled people with no family nearby. The work is carried out by volunteers who are supported by a paid member of staff. How it works is that when a request for help is received the paid worker will visit to asses the job then decide if it's something the volunteers can do. If so, a date for the work will be arranged with the householder. For both gardening and decorating jobs we provide the equipment and labour whilst the householder provides the materials - paints, plants etc. We do not charge for this service but ask people to make a donation to the volunteer centre to help us cover the cost of the volunteers' lunches and travel.
