





Braunston Walkers - Saturday 18/11/2006 Flecknoe- Catesby-Staverton and back (approx 11 miles)

After two days of monsoon weather we feared the worst as 11 of us met up at the village hall. The sun shone down from an unbroken blue sky and a chill wind stopped everyone from becoming too sweaty. We walked down to bottom lock where Carol joined the group and we started the steep climb on the Jurassic Way, without oxygen, over the disused railway and up to the high point at 146 metres above sea level. Fantastic views to the village over the Warwickshire plain.

We crossed the prairie field on the far side of the A45 and aimed to miss Braunston covert which we knew would be seriously muddy. Eventually we got on track past Berryfields farm after several brave members of our group traversed a ditch. As usual crows circled menacingly over the farm like hungry vultures as we rejoined the path towards Flecknoe.

Dropping down to the old Miry Bridge over the River Leam we were surprised to find that it had been dug out to improve flow. Traces of the old bridge could be seen in the surrounding earthworks. Uphill and yet another fantastic view across fields to the church and village of Braunston. Avoiding the worst of the mud and clay left by the bulldozers we crossed the fishing lake in the disused railway and approached Flecknoe.

Carol offered Werthers Originals and Mary dried apricots as we paused to catch our breaths. We cut through the small village on a footpath which seemed to go through peoples gardens, past the pub that never opens and then out of the village on the surprisingly busy road to Catesby.

Crossing the A425 we joined a metalled farm track and continued past the site of the medieval village of Newbold and through the seemingly deserted Upper farm before crossing the old disused railway midway between Staverton Viaduct and Catesby Viaduct which was built to cross the mighty River Leam. In the near distance we could see Shuckborough Hall and more importantly the Countryman pub at Staverton although that looked much closer than it really was. Perhaps it was a mirage!!

We walked over the magnificent old Catesby Viaduct where we peered over the edge at the river snaking its way far below. Our path then lead us over an extremely muddy field before joining a metalled farm track to take us up to Bates Farm, no relation to Norman Bates from Psycho as far as I know. Feeling very thirsty and hungry we trudged on across another muddy field and into a wooded valley then up a field to a stile (the stiles seemed to get higher every time we tackled one!) and finally to a meadow that lead us up to the main road and the welcome site of the Countryman pub in Staverton.

This leg of the journey was about 7 to 8 miles so we were ready for the refreshing beer and excellent baguette. We sat and glowed in the warmth of the pub before reluctantly tearing ourselves away to walk the few miles back to Braunston braving the muddy Braunston covert we joined the old London Road and dropped back into the village after a

fantastic walk...


