

Rev W Bevan Griffiths

It is with sadness that I report the death of 'Rev Bev' at the age of 93. He retired from Braunston to his beloved W ales and was taking Services in the Welsh language into his nineties. His funeral took place in Wales on 2nd October 2006.

He was Rector of Braunston for 20 years, arriving when I was a little girl and leaving when I had been at work for a number of years. In those long off days, Braunston was his sole responsibility and was a smaller village than it is now-how times have changed!

He asked us questions and listened to our answers when we were little, cared for us in the good times and the bad, made us welcome at the Rectory in our teenage years and challenged us as we grew into adulthood. He could be seen most days on his bike or walking in the village - visiting those who couldn't be in Church and finding out what those who could have been in Church, and weren't, had been up to!

His passing has caused quite a lot of reminiscing to take place-Kath Hyde and I have a vision of Rev Bev on ice skates at 'the Silver Blades' on a trip out with youngsters many years ago.

His 20 years of ministry had a big effect on my life and he is remembered with great affection.

AN APPEAL FOR YOUR VILLAGE HALL.

Dear Neighbours,

I wonder if you saw the old pictures in the "Images of Old Braunston" booklet recently published. The pictures of the Village Hall in times past spoke of a day when the Hall, then the village school, was the hub of the village. Today, the Hall is still a busy place with a wide variety of groups and activities making use of its facilities. But there is always room for some more.

Would you like to have more say in the running of the Village Hall? Perhaps you have an idea for improving the services which the Village Hall provides? We are looking for local people to help out in various ways, both practically and financially. Could you offer your skills in e.g. Organisation, administration, finance, fund-raising, , building maintenance, security, etc?

If your job involves arranging or going to meetings or conferences, have you considered Braunston Village Hall as a venue? The fully modernised kitchen is available for your catering and hiring costs are much less than dedicated conference venues.

Some of the suggestions to date include establishing a (regular?) car boot/table top sale and promoting the Hall as a wedding/birthday/anniversary celebration venue for the benefit of Braunston residents.

The Village Hall committee meets once monthly and we welcome anyone who would like to make be involved. However, a willingness to contribute in other ways is more valuable than attending meetings!

No appeal would be complete without an appeal for financial help!

Currently, the committee is planning the construction of a safe, outdoor play area in the Hall grounds for Braunston's pre-school children. The estimated costs of this will be in the region of £38k. To date we have collected £23k from various sources.

Could you help to make up the shortfall? A donation of any size would be welcomed towards this worthy project.

MORE NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE HALL

The previous item from Steve is an appeal for more people to get involved with the running of the Hall. Steve was elected to the management committee at our last AGM and has volunteered to take on the role of Vice Chair, trying to get more people involved and to lead our fund-raising efforts. We have a new team, that includes our new Booking Officers of Rob and Dee Whittington, and Avril Dent who is our Treasurer, plus Cindy Brewster, our Secretary. Other trustees of the Hall include representatives of the village and many of the regular users of the Hall.

Trying to maintain and improve our old building is an onerous and expensive task. Our Pre-School Playground project has attracted funding from many different sources and we were very grateful to receive news earlier this month that we had been awarded a grant of £2500 from **E-on/Central Networks** from their Safer Environment Fund, who are funding the safety fencing around the area. This brings us a little nearer to our target, and is gratefully received.

It is a big boost after the problems we experienced over the Summer when the Village Hall was twice broken into and all the fire extinguishers stolen. One was let off inside the main hall, and meant it took 5 hours to clean and make the Hall useable again. Oddly, only one damaged fire extinguisher was recovered within the village, so if anyone does know where they ended up, please let us or the police know. The cost of replacing these necessary items was over £500. Because entry was gained by breaking a window and cleverly ending up in one of the Preschool cupboards, the broken glass amongst their toys and dressing- up clothes meant that everything had to be thrown away and will cost the Pre-School several hundred pounds to replace. If anyone has any information on who did this, or any other damage to the Hall that seems to occur with regular monotony, then please call me, Lynne on 890865, or let the police know.

We are now in the run-up to Christmas, when many fund-raising events are taking place at the Hall, not least the **Braunston Players' Music Hall** which raises, with your support, masses of money for the Village Hall. It is on for 4 nights from November 29^{th} until December 2^{nd} and is always sold out, so buy your tickets early for a great night out.

Things are swinging down Braunston Playing Field

Anybody who has been down to the playing field recently might have noticed that things are changing for the better.

The swings have been repainted and the swings really swing having all been rebushed, and the nursery seats replaced. Also the concrete is being broken up to be replaced, in this Health and Safety era, with a more impact absorbing surface.

What about that vacant space to the right of the swings? Hopefully by the time you read this a new Springer motor bike will be in place thanks to Braunston Parish Council!! Why has it taken so long? 'cos the sub assembly underground had to be dug out and overhauled as it had worked loose and was becoming unsafe..

Greater things are yet to come. A grant application has been made to Awards for All to extend the hard play area at the far end of the field to give a full size football/basketball pitch. It is hoped that whilst the ground work is being undertaken the area can be extended to incorporate an area for the long awaited skateboard ramps. The ramps might not be there but at least the area will be!!

The development will also incorporate a Youth Shelter.

It has also been agreed that the hedge to the left of the gate will be 'laid' over this coming winter thereby improving access on the footpath and increasing visibility. The weeds in the play area will be treated.

Unfortunately the Junior Football Team, without notice, has deserted the playing field, moving to Daventry. We therefore have two football pitches for hire!!

All this work is being undertaken by willing villagers. Labour might be free but material certainly aren't. We are therefore, between painting and digging etc. holding an **Autumn Fair in the Village Hall on Saturday 4th**November. Please give us your support!! Any further offers of help will always be welcome.




