Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

It is amazing how many different ways we have of communicating these days; by e-mail, phone, letter, television, radio, mobile phone. In the 21st Century it is hard to be 'out of touch', unless we choose to be.

Today in the 21st century more lines of communication are available to us than ever before- ways of 'keeping in touch'. As I write this I remember (again with a bit of sadness) the times I have not sent my friend a birthday card, or an encouraging text, or 'phoned home'. Or missed the opportunity to get in touch with some one in the Parish. Conversely, there have been times when linking up with an old friend, or receiving a phone call from someone special has made so much difference.

In our Wedding preparation evening we show a clip from 'The full Monty' where a husband and wife have reached a moment of crisis. The home where they live is gradually emptied of all it's contents by bailiffs- because the husband has fallen into bankruptcy. The greatest tragedy is that he never communicated his problems to his wife. There's quite a profound moment in the clip when she throws a garden gnome onto the ground and it shatters. The husband looks mortified; 'I thought you liked them', 'No,' she replies, 'I've never liked them'. The two, though

living together, had not communicated the really important information of their lives: including their likes, and their financial difficulties.

It's hard sometimes- to be honest, and up-to-date in our communication. When there is a lack of communication misunderstandings occur. This can happen on all levels- in marriage, between teacher and child, parent and child, friends, brothers and sisters. It can also happen, as we know too well, on a global scale. When one side does not want to 'listen' there is war and terror. With all our sophisticated forms of 'staying in touch' we sometimes don't really 'listen', we make assumptions and are quick to judge.

There are many things to look forward to as a Team this September. On 5th September Ashby is having a 'Welcome' Service- where I, as Vicar of Braunston, will be formally welcomed as having cure of souls of Ashby. It is going to be a different sort of Service- with it's liturgy based on the Covenant Methodist Service. A Service where we once again communicate with God and each other our desire to keep lines of communication 'open'. In September also Revd Liz will be joining us back from her Sabbatical in Korea. and we will be joined by Revd Simon- who is a priest from Korea. We look forward to listening to and

being enlarged by what is going on in a different Country to ours, and hearing from the Church in Korea.Revd Teresa too will have more opportunity to keep the line of communication open between our Churches and the Schools.

We have just finished 'Holiday Club' with around 60 children! It was a wonderful, fun and lively week. The theme we looked at this year with the children was 'Miracle Maker'. All week we were following the life and miracles of Jesus, and the miracle of his resurrection. God has communicated through His Word- Jesus- His love for us. He is the chosen one through which God keeps in touch with us.

As the new Term begins, revitalised by the holiday, perhaps it's an opportunity for us to try and 'stay in touch'. Listening and telling those we care about 'how it is for us'. Good communication leads to understanding. Communication is the bedrock of any good marriage, friendship, working relationship and cross-cultural friendship. The establishment of Shalompeace.

Jetty Field

We have been working on a survey of the plants in Jetty Field to identify the species that are there and to compare this with the last made by Duncan Gallie in the 1950s. Our hope would be to reintroduce the flowers in the Gallie last with seeds gathered from plants still growing in the near locality. If you would be willing to collect seeds or help in this work then please get in touch. We would also like to meet with anyone who could advise on the best ways to encourage the variety of bird life, small mammals and butterflies as well as other assorted bugs and bees.

We have sprayed out the graffiti that appeared in the garden area and done some preliminary clearing up of plants. Thanks for the continued efforts to collect litter and dirt - the general smart appearance of the place is due to a thousand small individual acts. We have been advised of a possible dangerous state of the summerhouse roof and have cordoned off the area. We await a survey.

There is a real expectation that the major contractor works will be complete by the end of the year. We, ourselves, need to do some preparatory work to set up possibilities for the Autumn and hope to make another appeal for volunteers to start their efforts again in October if they would be willing to endure another season of hard work. Great hopes for the near future.

We also now have the church floodlighting on again after the lightning damage and the clock should be working again soon.



Braunston Walkers - Saturday 19 August 2006 -

Napton-Priors Hardwick-Priors Marston (11.4 miles)

Ten walkers met up at the village hall with much trepidation and lots of waterproof gear given that all the weather forecasts were for monsoon conditions. We drove to Napton village hall and the set off on the walk. The sun shone down as we joined the Oxford canal towpath and walked south towards Marston Doles.

The canal locks here are just wide enough for one narrow boat at a time unlike the double ones on the Grand Union. We walked beside the canal and the boating holiday makers queuing to get through the locks. On our right was a field full of buffalo next to another field of bog standard cows. The good news was that they were all standing which clearly means the weather would remain fine. Along the towpath we saw many wild flowers such as gypsy wort, skullcap, St Johns wort and loosestrife as well as bushes full of the blue sloes for gin making.

We paused at Marston Doles and ate figs supplied by Jane and boiled sweets supplied by Terry. After a short rest we set off over the canal bridge and up a small farm track ill we reached a stile where our route took to the fields. Several wary rams eyed us suspiciously as we crossed their field to another stile and past an old ruined house with beautiful brickwork. The views across the Warwickshire plain were spectacular and we could see the Burton Dasset hills and beyond theat the hills of the northern cotswolds.

The way marked path eventually ook us into fields leading to Priors Iardwick but we took a deviated route long a farm track where we met an inquisive Jack Russell pup with his master and hen along a small footpath leading past the eautiful garden of Lino Pires, the Portugese

owner of the Butcher Arms restaurant. Leaving the old village of Priors Hardwick we set off across more fields and into Priors Marston where we were due for lunch at the Holly Bush pub. Excellent food and beer and a highly recommended pub. We sat outside in the sunshine enjoying our lunch and quaffing our beer.

Reluctantly dragging ourselves away from the pub we set off again over the yet to be harvested fields. The sun still shone down on us and it was warm as we continued on the long treck back to Napton. In Gyspsy Lane just out of Hellidon we met several people picking the ripe and juicy backberries that lined the route we ate our fair share before continuing on our route. The views over Napton this time were magnificent and we could see the Malvern hills in the far distance as well as Coventry with sun sparkling on its high rise buildings. Alan's GPS showed that we were at 526feet as we rambled down the valley and back to Napton village hall and home. Can you believe it? No rain and no need for waterproofs!!


