Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

I have just returned from a very uplifting Service at Peterborough Cathedral in which Marian Thomas, was licensed as Reader to the Daventry Team. From now on she will wear a 'blue scarf' in Church Services to show she has permission to officiate and preach - amongst many other roles!

I remember the first time Marian and I met. She rang the Rectory door bell and asked rather tentatively if we could accommodate her as a 'Reader in training'. Marian's dilemma came from the basis that she felt she wanted to spend time with her husband travelling the waterways, and felt that God was calling her to exercise a ministry with (as she puts it!) 'boaty people'. Her dilemma was that she lives in Weston Favell - which is quite a way from the canals!

It is wonderful to have Marian amongst us and we are looking forward to her exercising her ministry more fully now she is licensed. I invited her to write a few words for this month's BVN:

"As the new Reader in the Daventry Team- and being made so welcome by everyone I have met in Braunston Rev'd Claire has asked me to write a few words about how I came to be part of Church life here.

About six years ago I was suddenly aware that God wanted me to work with people who work on the canals.

At the time we did not have a boat, but very soon an advert appeared in the paper- - it said : 'The ultimate DIY job- sound hull suitable for refitting- Earls Barton. Tel:..etc.

I went and looked at it the next day and we bought it, but later decided it would be easier to fit out a new hull with the engine fitted- so we had one built at Long Itchington- and my husband Keith has fitted her out so beautifully. She is called 'Kharis' which is Greek for 'a gift bestowed' because my mother left me the money to pay for it.

So here we are, I am now a Readerthere are loads of boats and 'boaty people' in Braunston plus all the new friends we have made and we are waiting for God to lead us in the way He wants us to go. Please pray for me as I follow my new calling as I will pray for you. - Marian"

Also licensed today - were Parish Evangelists and Pastoral Assistants, who are accredited within Peterborough Diocese. But of course the Church is full of amazing people with many varied and diverse gifts. Saint Paul in his letter to the Romans describes the Church as a body- made up of many parts. In Church I can think of folk who have gifts of hospitality, pastoral gifts, administration, compassion, prayer,

wisdom, gifts with children and the not so young - and so the list goes on. In Rugby outside the Methodist Church at the moment there is sign that reads: 'God does not call the qualified, He qualifies the called.' Maybe you can think of the job you are in which feels like a 'vocation', or the gift you have.

When we respond to God's call or 'tug' He will provide us with the means to exercise our gifts- for the benefit of others, and as a way of serving the Church and our community. We may feel inadequate to the task - but God provides the strength and wisdom needed. So I pray that Marian would in her 'gutsy' way be an inspiration to us: follow the leadings of your heart and God will equip you.



Braunston Walkers - Saturday 20 May 2006 - Everdon Stubbs (approx 8 miles)

This walk through the bluebell woods was to have been lead by Fonella but as she is to have her baby soon she thought it might not be such a good idea. The walkers group all wish her well.

For the first time since we formed in February 2005 the weather looked decidedly iffy. Up until now our luck had held and even in the winter on our walks we had invariably set out in sunshine. The sky looked ominous as we drove to Weedon to start the walk.

Eleven intrepid walkers started out from the car park in Lower Weedon and set off over the fast flowing River Nene and then through the churchyard. The footpath soon joins the Grand Union Canal and we proceeded on the towpath until we reached the railway bridge. We even had some sunshine at this point in the walk.

Our path took in several fields of wheat before entering a field of bright yellow Rape. The plants stood shoulder high and the recent rain had knocked some of the stems over so that a machete would have been very useful. Sadly even Terry had not packed one in his rucksack. We fought our way through and after some gymnastics in the mud we crossed over a stile to a meadow on the side of the hill leading up to Church Stowe village. Pausing to catch our breath we admired the views back over the fields and up to the radio mast above Daventry. We ambled through the village and followed the road. The hedgerows were full of pink campion and bluebells, just a taste of what was to come.

Our road lead us past Stowe Lodge with views to our right over the field to Farthingstone which we had visited in a previous walk. In the distance we could see rain over towards Daventry but thankfully we were still walking in the dry. We turned right at a crossroads and immediately joined the footpath across a field of rather frisky bullocks and into Hath Farm. We were informed that bulls are colour blind and although we had thought that Terry's red jacket was to be their target that was not the case! We passed them safely and to our right we could see the golf course that we had crossed on a previous walk.

We finally arrived at the corner of Everdon Stubbs and the woods were carpeted with bluebells in all directions. A mgnificent show even appreciated by the cuckoo we could hear calling. In amongst the bluebells were Yellow Archangel flowers as well as more pink campions. We wandered through the bluebell woods and came out on the road to Everdon. Carol and Jane handed out welcome toffees and bird seed snacks as we paused again to admire the woods.

We walked down into Everdon village with its huge church and made for The Plough, our lunchtime halt. Whilst in the pub the monsoon started in earnest and we waited for some time in the hope that it would miraculously clear for us to start walking again. No such luck, so donning boots and waterproofs we prepared for the walk back. We visited the old church with its strange windmill carving in the screen

near the alter and its minstrel gallery that isn't and then had to brave the rain as we started the walk back down to Little Everdon where we joined the Nene Way to return to Weedon.

It was drizzly but not really heavy rain as we trudged along and dropped back into Weedon and the cars for home. An excellent walk in glorious countryside. Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, normally on the third Saturday in the month. They are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful Northamptonshire scenery.

Jetty Field wins Northamptonshire Pocket Parks Award

The last workday concentrated on the clearance of the ditch behind Archer Avenue. A huge amount of accumulated debris was removed and the stream is now flowing easily. We hope that this will have solved the winter flooding problem of recent years.

And now is the time for the volunteer help to get in a well-earned summer rest. But there are plans afoot to deliver 20 tons of stone in the autumn so the rest is to gather strength. Over 1000 hours have been donated to this project to achieve an amazing amount within twelve months. There are still many smaller tasks still to do and if any individual or family could help over the summer with such things as grass mowing, some attention to trees and shrubs, painting metal hurdles and graffiti removal then please give me 890590 or Carol 891310 a ring.

Thanks to all who have been using the rubbish sacks. It is clear that many walkers are picking up litter as they go and that dog owners are clearing up after their charges. It makes such a difference to everyone. Please keep dogs on a lead until clear of the garden and allotment areas - kids use the garden and food is growing on the allotments.

Various negotiations and consultations are nearly complete and we expect to be able to start on fencing and gate improvements soon. Permanent rubbish and dog bins are the next to plan and we will be reopening some discussions on the possibility of some interpretative boards.

The most exciting recent event was the announcement that we had been chosen for an award by Northamptonshire Pocket Parks to assist with the next stage of development of the park. This involved some sleepless nights, stringent deadlines and the production of a Management Plan for the next 5 years. The application had to specify improvements to suit tight criteria but we now have £2000 to spend on hedge planting, tree and shrub replacement, seeds, a notice board and publicity. We never close.


