

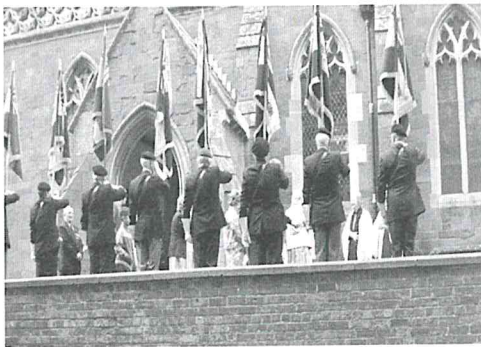

Vicar’s Letter

Dear Friends,

Today I learnt more about football! In the World Cup match between England and Sweden two of the goals were caused by the defenders being weak on the “set pieces”. Now I don’t recall hearing that expression amongst commentators before. Has it always been a term in the footballing world, or is it a recent expression? Whatever, according to Sven and the ITV commentators - thats what the boys have got to work on! (Am I right in thinking a “set piece” is something like defending the goal when a corner or free kick is taken? Answers on a post card...)

I like football but I don’t watch it enough to know everything about it. In the same way expressions or terms we use in Church may seem familiar but when push comes to shove could we give an answer to what the term means in a pub quiz?

Every month we write 8 am Holy Communion, 11 am Parish Communion or Family

Communion in the BVN. I was reminded the other day that these words may appear as foreign to some...as “set pieces” appears to me! To complicate matters further, other churches may use the word “Eucharist, “Lord’s Supper” or “Mass” for the same type of service. This being said I will now attempt to give you a very quick “cook’s tour” of these terms!

Each of these are names of this particular Church Service where bread and wine are taken. The names reflect a different aspect of the grace of God. The word “*Communion*” means fellowship - with each other and with God. So exchanging the peace is important within the service - because through shaking our neighbor’s hand we are offering the Lord’s peace and also showing we are at peace with each other..

We call the service “*Holy Communion*” which focuses on the fact that through Christ we have union with God - who is to be

revered. We call it "*Parish Communion*" because as the Church in this place we offer to God prayers for our Parish.

Sometimes in Churches the word "*Eucharist*" is used which in the Greek means "thanksgiving" or gratitude. In the second half of the service we say the "thank you prayer" or "*Eucharistic prayer*". Thanking God for his creation, His saving act through Christ, His forgiveness and love for us.

In some churches the term for this service is "*the Lord's Supper*" because as we are offered the bread and wine we are reminded of Jesus' words to his disciple the night before he died. "Take, eat in remembrance of me" and "Drink this in remembrance that I died for you" Bringing into the present what Jesus did for us on the cross.

In a lot of Catholic Churches the service we call Holy Communion is called "*Mass*" which in Latin means "dismiss". We are sent out each week with the words

"Go in peace to love and serve the Lord"

The service of Holy Communion has of course changed over the years. The present Anglican worship is called "Common Worship" - which means that our Worship should give God His worth - retain some mystery and dignity, *whilst* authentically representing the prayers of the people of this place and time. Hence in recent years the Church has sought "Fresh expressions" - new ways of being Church. *Family Communion* - which we have in Braunston on the fourth Sunday - is such a fresh expression. Keeping the richness of the Communion and involving all ages. That is our aim.

I hope you all have a really good holiday. You are always welcome to worship when you can.

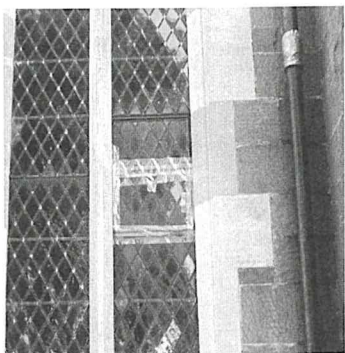
Thank you so much to all who made the day such a memorable success. You will be pleased to hear £1,585 was raised for Church funds.

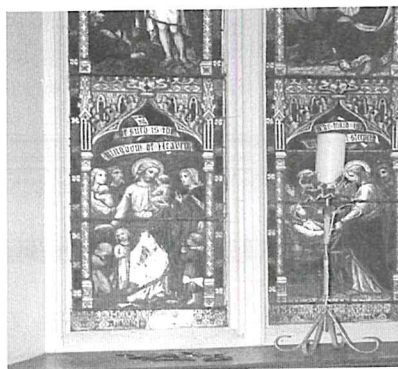

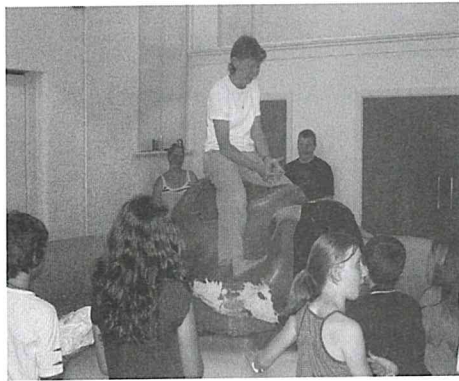



Braunston Walkers - Saturday 17 June 2006 - Arbury Hill (approx 12 miles)

Five of us set out from base camp, the village hall, in blazing sunshine for a quick romp over to Staverton where we were to meet the rest of the group for our attempt at the summit of Arbury Hill. This is supposedly the highest hill in Northamptonshire and also reputedly the source of the mighty River Nene. The heat was unrelenting as we arrived in Staverton after the long haul up the Braunston Lane and on into the welcome shade on the village green.

Eleven of us left Staverton and re-joined the Jurassic Way aiming for the magnificent engineering feat of Catesby viaduct. We remembered how, on our first walk in February 2005, difficult it had been crossing freshly ploughed fields to reach the viaduct. We had resembled deep sea divers with our boots gaining mud and weight as we trekked across the fields wondering whether we really wanted to see the viaduct at all. No problem with wet mud at this time of year but we did have to fight our way across rape fields setting off the hay fever sufferers. Yet again no one had packed a machete!! Our leader reassured us that this was the last rape field to tackle as we crossed a wheat field that looked ready to harvest and immediately plunged into yet another stifling rape field! Those wearing shorts were wondering at the wisdom of this as we plunged through stinging nettles in the heat.

We continued across several fields past Bates Farm and a herd of bullocks and dropped down to the viaduct and then along fields to reach Lower Catesby where we turned left and entered the blessed shade of the tree lined avenue that leads up to the beautiful Catesby Manor on the brow of the hill. Pausing in the shade along with sev-

eral hundred hot and extremely noisy sheep to drink water and eat Jane's Foxes glacier mints. Do you know that they still sport a polar bear on the label and not a fox?

We walked along the shady avenue and then into the grounds of the big house across their landscaped gardens and past carp filled lakes until we reached the trees where we could glimpse the entrance to the now disused Catesby rail tunnel. Yet another fantastic engineering feat which stretches for one and a half miles under the hills.

The path lead us through Upper Catesby and across meadows with Arbury Hill (225 metres) on our left and the much lower Sharman's Hill (224 metres) on our right. We turned left and took the bridle way between the hills. There is no actual foot-path to the top of Arbury Hill but there is a Motor cross track and as there were no motorbikes roaring around we branched off the path and soon reached the summit. The views from here are stunning and panning left to right we could make out Shuckborough Hall, Staverton village and behind that the distant village of Braunston shimmering in the heat, Borough Hill mast at Daventry and then Newnham, Badby and Badby woods. Magnificent and well worth the effort. The only drawback to this idyllic scene was that there was not a pub at the top so we dropped down the valley and joined the road towards Badby.

We walked past a pond surrounded by Yellow Flag lilies and full of tench bubbles. After taking our lives into our hands crossing the A361 we dropped down through the village for a warm welcome at The Malsters pub. Highly recommended the beer, barmaid and food were all fabulous

as we rested our weary bodies before the walk back home. They kindly refilled our dry water bottles and we set off.

Along the next field Jane spotted the extremely rare blue and white marsh orchids growing along the under hedgerows and shortly after that a field full of yellow hop trefoils. It was getting even hotter as we walked up to Staverton village and then took the low track back to Braunston. Arriving at bottom lock exhausted and baking hot we paused to buy ice creams and sat at the lock side to rest before the steep walk up Jetty field and home.

This is a really excellent walk taking in some of our most beautiful, undiscovered Northamptonshire scenery.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, normally on the third Saturday in the month. They are not too strenu-

ous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful Northamptonshire scenery please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384.

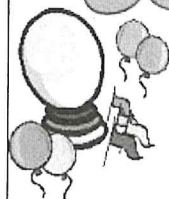

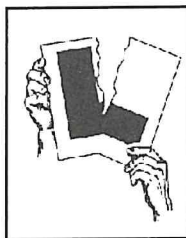

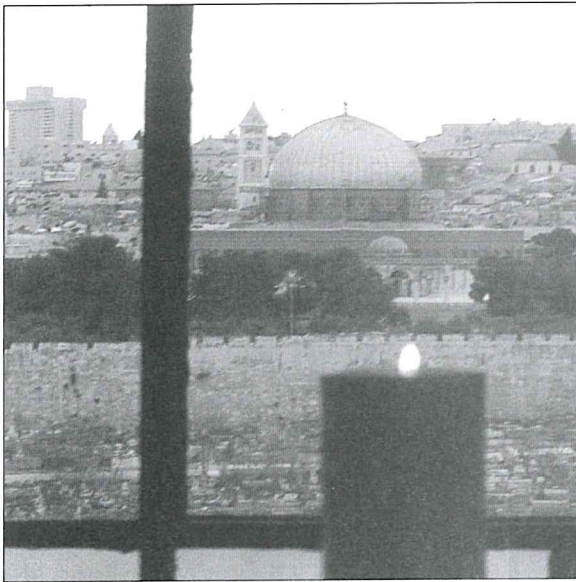
