Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

It was good to see so many of you over Easter. Thank you for joining us through Holy Week and on Easter day. It was a very meaningful week and a really uplifting service at 11am on Easter day! I would like to take the opportunity in this BVN to give you plenty of notice about our Confirmation service —it is to be on St. Michael's Day Friday 29th September 7.30pm. Once again it promises to be an exciting and meaningful occasion. The Rector of the Daventry Team, Revd Owen Page, talks about Confirmation in this month's Team talk magazine and I'm quoting from his letter:

"What is Confirmation?

It is a very special time in the life of Christians when they decide to state publicly that they will strive to follow Christ. It is at this service where the confirmation candidates say for themselves those baptismal vows which their parents and Godparents said at the time of their christening.

But it is also much more than that:

Confirmation is a time when the Bishop lays his hands on the heads of the candidates and asks God's Holy Spirit to **strengthen** them in their newly transformed Christian life. He also anoints them with the Holy Oil of Chrism. This ceremony of the Church is known as a sacrament – an outward and visible sign of an inward and invisible grace. As in Holy Communion and Baptism, so also in Confirmation: God, through his Holy Spirit comes to those newly confirmed people in a very special way. He gives them his presence with them for the rest of their lives.

What Confirmation is NOT!

- It is not a 'coming of age' ceremony
- It is not just for teenagers

- It is not something you do just because your parents want it
- Although it does mean that you would regularly make your Holy Communion after being confirmed, it is not just an 'entrance' to Holy Communion
- Financially it costs you nothing: spiritually, it is beyond price

If you are aged from 11 years – 105 years and wish to enquire more about Confirmation please come and talk to any of the Team Clergy. If you are not yet Baptised (Christened) that is not a problem as this would take place in the same service.

We will be planning a series of 'classes' after Easter which will suit all age groups and will hopefully help you understand

more fully your Confirmation, your Church and your Faith."

OLD SPECTACLES? - UNUSED TOOLS?

We all grow out of our glasses, don't we – and I have yet to find an optician willing to offer part exchange! And what about tools? Those old spades and trowels; the spanners that no longer fit metric nuts; the hand drill that doesn't quite work properly and which you have abandoned in favour of an electric one?

The Rotary Club of Daventry can put all these discarded items to good use and help to support those less fortunate than ourselves in the Developing World.

The Daventry Rotary Club has sent more than 18,000 pairs of spectacles to Africa and India in the last few years through the auspices of Vision Aid Overseas. The glasses are sorted by Vision Aid teams, classified, repaired where necessary and then despatched to Vision Aid Centres throughout the Developing World, where they make a huge difference to the lives of people who could never afford, nor have the opportunity to acquire, new glasses.

Unwanted tools, that is to say garden tools, carpentry tools, spanners, drills (though nothing electric), pliers or other similar items (indeed, any hand tool) can form the basis of invaluable tool kits to help those in countries where such items are difficult or impossible to obtain. The Rotary Club forwards these to the Tools for Self Reliance workshop in Northampton where they are refurbished by a team of disabled workers before being gathered into sets and dispatched overseas.

Thus, you are helping two lots of people; by providing employment here to those who may otherwise have difficulty finding work and by providing vital equipment to the poor and under-privileged overseas.

From the Archives

"GARDENING NOTES by Frank Cox - May 1993, Issue No 263

May is often the month when the garden begins to make up for a slow start in Spring. But don't be caught out by the late frosts which sometimes persist until the middle of the month in our area, and be ready to protect tender plants if necessary

Seeds will not germinate unless the ground is warm enough and it is worthwhile investing in a soil thermometer to tell you the right moment to sow them.

Lift bulbs which have finished flowering and temporarily plant them in spare ground until the foliage dies back naturally. This will make room for the summer bedding plants which should now be hardening off ready for setting out.

Rake in 1 to 20z per square yard of a general fertiliser such as "Growmore" before planting out dahlias and outdoor chrysanthemums. Pinch out the growing tips on chrysanths two or three weeks after planting and reduce the number of new shoots to about six.

Watch roses for any signs of black spot, rust or mildew and, if necessary spray with a systemic fungicide which can also check the old enemy, greenfly.

All growing shrubs should be fed, watered and then mulched around them. Mow established lawns to keep pace with growth and newly-sown lawns when the grass is about 2" high"





turret and down into Sulgrave. There is a lot of landscaping going on outside the village with a series of lakes and the ground was exceptionally muddy when we had recced the walk in March but now they have considerately laid a stone path. Our lunch spot was the Star Inn at Sulgrave, highly recommended, and the landlord had the baguettes ready when we arrived. After a pint or two of Old Hookey we were ready to face the longer half of the walk.

We walked down the road and viewed Sulgrave Manor the ancestral home of George Washington. Wasn't he lucky to live in a village with such a great pub?
