Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

8pm Evening Service

I'm sitting here in the study looking out at the beautiful blue sky & sunshine (wow!). By the time you will read this we will be in the thick of Lent (but will have 18 days left of Lent approximately) and hopefully still enjoying this beautiful weather!

Last year I went into the shop called Thornton's. I was talking with a friend about Lent & said to the assistant a general comment about it and she commented; 'I don't think we have a chocolate called Lent.' She really didn't know what Lent was, and this year I've come across other people who don't really know either: -

What is Lent?

Lent is a time of reflecting on the suffering Jesus went through to save us. It is a time for looking at ourselves – (are we really ok with our friends, neighbours & God?) What have I done wrong? Lent is a time for spring-cleaning our lives.

Lent is also reminder that Jesus went through suffering to make him stronger and more trusting in Father God.

Many people fast during Lent which means giving up food for a day or sometimes many days. The aim is to help use time and energy thinking about God.

When does Lent begin?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, six and a half weeks before Easter Day.

The last week of Lent begins with Palm Sunday, which celebrates the day Jesus entered Jerusalem and the people lay down palms at his feet.

Why does Lent last for 40 days?

The 40 days mark the 40 years of the Israelites going through the desert and the traditional 40 days of Jesus fasting in the desert.

Why are Sundays not counted in the 40 days?

Sundays are always a day of celebration in the Christian church and so they cannot be included in the 40 days of Lent. Sundays commemorate the Resurrection.

During lent we have a number of special services:

Ash Wednesday began the season of lent

Mothering Sunday 2nd March 11am Palm Sunday 16th March 10-30am processional starts at the Wheatsheaf Maundy Thursday 20th March 7pm – come for a meal

Good Friday 21st March (Children's workshop 10-12, adult meditation 2-3pm)

Easter Saturday Vigil 22nd March – evening service 8pm

In the church we use purple for Lent (on the altar cloths) which means both sorrow & royalty.

Lent gives way to Holy week and it is then that we appreciate the true suffering of Christ and God's passion for the world. Remembering Jesus at the last Supper, this year we are going to eat a Passover meal together (with food and wine- to which you are warmly invited.) This night marked a time of friendship but also betrayal and denial.

Then if you see the spire on Good Friday- it is the only Friday in the whole year it isn't lit. Commemorating the day Jesus died on the cross and lay in the tomb. He sympathises with the sorrow and sadness of us all and it is as if this is the end.

What's so special about the Easter Vigil on Saturday 22nd March 2008 is the Easter fire we light and the words which resonate in the Church 'the light of Christ'. Then comes Easter morn, when, with the excitement of finding Easter eggs, and indulging in chocolate- we remember the joy of one who is alive for ever more.

The long journey of Lent is over and there is the resurrection joy which we carry with us through the year.

When we sing 'Jesus Christ is risen today!' on Easter morn you can't help but get the goose bumps!

'But the pains that he endured, Our salvation have procured; Now above the sky he's King, Where the angels ever sing. Alleluia!'

It would be great to see you anytime during lent and on Easter day. Do come!

Parish Council News

Planning Appeal

An Appeal has been lodged against the District Council's refusal to allow planning Permission to demolish the old Methodist Chapel and to develop the site for housing. The Appeal hearing has been set for 10:00am on Wednesday 26th March in the Council Chamber at the District Council Offices. The Parish Council together with the Braunston History Society and many village residents raised strong objections to the application, which would mean the loss of yet another of Brauston's historic buildings.

Footpath Bid

A big thank you to the many villagers who supported the Parish Council in it's application to the County Council for a 'Footpath Modification Order' to allow the connecting track through the old station yard, between footpath ED8 and the A45, to be designated an official footpath. The track has been used by generations of villagers - probibly since before the railway line was built - and has always provided access to the footpaths on the South side of the A45 as well providing a safe, traffic free walk to and from the village and the School, for residents of The Wharf, Old Road and Hill Row . Unfortunately the County Council will not start to proceess the bid until Autumn 2008 due to their heavy work load and we have been warned that it may take a considerable time to complete.

Church Yard Trees

The last remaining conifers, alongside the footpath through the Churchyard from Church Road, are suffering from age and storm damage, have been declared 'unsafe' and must now be removed. These have been a landmark for a great many years and will be very much missed. However the Parish Council will be replanting with Yew trees, which will continue the work already started last year. The Yews will make a fine replacement as they are much longer lived and can be trimmed and shaped at any stage in their life. We hope they will be a beautiful feature in the Churchyard for many centuries to come.

From Angela Foster - Braunston Village Stores and Post Office



Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 16 February 2008 Ashby St Ledgers Watford Gap (11 miles)

With unbroken blue sky, sunshine and enough frost on the ground to firm up the mud ten of us set off along the Ashby Road out of Braunston. Super views back over the village as we climbed up the grassy track. This was a road as shown on a map from the 1830s but is now a bridle way which meets the Barby Road on top of a ridge.

We crossed the road and started a steady descent down to Ashby St Ledgers. After crossing the hazardousA361 we entered the lovely old village and walked past the thatched houses until we reached the junction and the old thatched house which had been sadly gutted by fire and is now being repaired. The neighbouring cottage has a thatched jet airliner along with the statutory peacocks. Thankfully this had escaped the blaze.

We paused to take a look around the old church with its triple decker pulpit and some interesting old artwork on the walls. Leaving the village we passed by the war memorial designed by Luytens and crossed fields looking back at the beautiful old manor house and the

lake. This path eventually reaches the main railway. Only a few years ago you would have had to cross the line on foot, hopefully avoiding an unscheduled visit to London Euston plastered to the front of a Virgin express! Now there is a tunnel to take you over or rather under the busy line.

Crossing the A5, opposite Broad Lane caravans, our path lead us to the Grand Union Canal where a bridge over the lock allowed us to join the towpath past the motorway services at Watford Gap and on past Welton Hythe marina then over a bridge or two at the canal junction to finally reach the Narrow Boat Inn on the A5 next to a lock. Whilst walking along the towpath Terry did his Tarzan impression swinging out over the canal on a rope that still hangs from an old tree. He made it back to the bank with dry feet this time as well.

We settled down for a welcome lunch at the pub with a pint of foaming "Old Hookey" Wonderful!

After lunch we continued on the canal to the tunnel with magnificent

JETTY FIELD IN SPRING

All the planning of the last few months is turning into action. Winter fades and new shapes begin. The wildlife area has had its first sectional thinning. One part only at a time has to be pruned down to maintain the right environment for the wild things but the rest is left untouched [relatively] so that any animals and insects can easily migrate to an undisturbed patch. The field seems in better heart than it was at this time last year when the prolonged heavy rains left it waterlogged and the vegetation rotted. Continuous work on the trees from both professional contractors and volunteers has produced healthy and well-shaped specimens. And the bulbs are beginning to show again.

The major works in the garden continue and will produce much improved access and through routes and a nature trail is being established to link the various parts. And there is still a surprise to come thanks to a generous donation from the Admiral Nelson as a result of adopting us as their charity recipient this last year. More details on this later.

So all the work is finished then? Not a bit of it! Time has come to add to those 2000 volunteer hours. There can be very few projects in the county [or the country] that can point to that impressive number. We can all be massively and justifiably proud. And ready to fling ourselves into another season of spadework. The next workday is on Saturday 15^{th} March. Pruning, sweeping, tree planting and stone path extension.
