Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

There is a very effective slogan Christian Aid use:

'We believe in life before death' Something worth remembering when there's a knock on your door on May 11th -17th, and the collectors for Christian Aid ask for a donation!

We all I'm sure want a better life for Zimbabweans and the people in Afghanistan, Iraq and Dhafur. So please give generously.

I wonder what your favourite Charity is? For some I know the Aircraft Ambulance is a favourite choice- not least because you may know from personal experience how it has 'saved someone'. For others it is the work of

Macmillan's. For others Oxfam or RSPCA. Each of us could tell a story as to why this charity has special significance.

On May 11th in our Family Service we are going to have a Charities Service as our 'Big Event'. To it we have invited three speakers from three charities which All Saints' Church supports. Also around the room will be tables where you can bring fliers and posters to raise awareness of the Charity you would like to publicise. The Service will end with nibbles and drink from Fairtrade which will be freely given for us all to sample and enjoy.

Last night I attended a concert run by Rotary raising money for research into Motor Neurone Disease. There were young people and older people sharing their talents in order to support this very worthwhile cause. A twelve year old playing his oboe brilliantly. What talent! Finding something we are good at and sharing it is 'life giving' for the person giving as well as the person receiving it adds to life being richer and more special.

In Church we are not only concerned with eternal life but life in the here and now. As I came to bless a young lad at the communion rail this morning and placed my hand gently on his head- he looked me straight in the eye and just nodded his head enthusiastically. It was like he was

saying 'yes' to whatever God had to offer.

One of Jesus' most amazing sayings is this:

'I have come that everyone may have life and have it in abundance.' John 10:10

In this season of Pentecost, we remember how Jesus ascended leaving us with his Holy Spirit. Let us follow the spirit's direction in being 'life giving' in the way we approach each other and endeavour to share ourselves and our talents as generously as we can.

I will probably have to re-read these words in the months ahead to remind myself! Within the Daventry Team soon we will be down to two clergy and I'm sure the workload temporarily will seem quite overwhelming. Revd Liz wrote a message in her magazine- 'please show your support for us by coming to Church!' I re-iterate this! Not out of

sympathy for us but because if you even have a mustard seed of faith in God- see how He has blessed you. Your Church is the natural place to give thanks, and to receive from Him love and life in all it's abundance.* Say 'yes' to the One who has said 'yes' to you.





Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 19/04/2008 - Kilsby (10.5 Miles)

The weather forecast threatened heavy rain as fifteen of us set off from the village hall to walk the length of the village and down the fields to join the Oxford canal towpath for the long walk to Onley. In the summer this is a favourite haunt of kingfishers but there were none today. It was still dry with a cold wind as we joined the path that climbs steeply uphill to join Elkington Lane into the village of Barby. Sheep bleated as we walked along the lane and into the village. One field was full of black sheep with only one solitary white sheep of the family. Leaving Barby, via the old churchyard, we spotted many graves of the Elkington family that must have been an important family in the nineteenth century. The graveyard was full of primroses. We left the village through a small housing estate and dropped down the fields towards Kilsby, under the M45, past some purple blooming Honesty and on to our welcome lunch stop The George Pub. The food and beer and welcome was wonderful and is amongst the best pubs we have ever visited. The chips were second to none and this is definitely a highly recommended spot.

Our path leads us reluctantly away from the pub and followed the busy A5 eventually leading past a wood with huge air vents for the railway tunnel passing below. As trains pass there was a roar from the vents. We crossed two fields and joined a small footpath that runs at the back of the landfill site. It had been a working day when we had recced this walk and the stench was overpowering but with no workers stirring up the mess it was OK. When you see the amount of land it uses it makes you think how important recycling really is!

We soon entered a small swampy bit of woodland and then crossed several fields to arrive at Ashby St Ledgers. Still the weather was dry and cold but no sign of the expected deluge, thankfully! We turned right along what used to be a road but is now just a footpath into the village. Walking along the main street we passed the Old Coach House pub, now reopened after extensive refurbishment. After crossing the busy A361 we joined the Jurassic Way footpath to take us back to Braunston and a welcome cuppa!

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy monthly rambles. They are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take

in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery. Remember you don't have to do the full walk some of our members arrange pick ups from the pub stop halfway, normally 5 or 6 miles. Please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384. We normally meet at 10 o'clock at the village hall.




