

Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

I write this with a couple of days left before I embark on the Santiago de Compestella – in Spain. I go a little naively knowing that a big walk awaits, 15-20 miles a day, probably a lot of blisters to be encountered on the way and nights spent in pilgrim hostels. I'm not sure really why I'm doing it...except that 'I like walking' and the enthusiasm of the person leading us, Revd Ian Holdsworth- with excitement in his eyes has been enough to galvanise five of us to set off from Heathrow on Sunday!

When walking- the legs keep going (hopefully!) leaving the mind free to reflect, and dream. I will be leaving behind the phone, the diary, but will carry a lot of the people of Braunston

in my thoughts. There will also be plenty of European people to talk to and listen to along the way. Fellow pilgrims following the way of St James the Apostle. I am very lucky to have the means to pay for this trip, and as my sister (a nurse) reminds metwo arms and two legs to be able to do it!

During the season of Pentecost we are reminded of the words of Christ;

'Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them, if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

John 20:21-23

The Spirit has life-giving qualities- it breathed over the waters at the beginning of Creation and was breathed into Adam- as the breath of life. The Spirit inspires, comforts, and strengthens. This week I have been very aware of the Spirit of life in community. In community the spirit of God is evident in laughter, the motivation to 'get things done' and in the willingness to care. With God's help enabling us on earth to reflect heaven just that bit more.

Yesterday I visited a young woman in hospital. She is terminally ill and just wanted to see a priest. Bravely facing the next part of her journey she just wanted the opportunity to say sorry to God and to receive reassurance of His forgiveness and his care and love for her. What a tremendous humbling privilege to join with her in prayer and to go to the source of life himself, for comfort and peace.

We are all on a journey and as I go (by the time you read this I will probably be back!) bear a thought for the Spirit of God who brings each one of us lifelife in all it's fullness: in creation, in our preservation and in the fullness of eternal life.


BRAUNSTON PLAYERS



Daventry Team Sponsored Walk Rogation Sunday 27/4/2008 (13.9 miles)

According to the encyclopaedia, Rogation days are four days in the church calender traditionally set apart for solemn processions to invoke God's mercy. I did not see much solemnity and heard much laughter and chatter as we walked the 14 miles from Daventry All Saints church to churches at Welton, Ashby St Ledgers, Braunston, Staverton, Catesby and finally Hellidon. That morning the weather forecast for the day was so blue with rain I thought there was something wrong with my TV colour setting! So we all arrived at Daventry church kitted out for the deluge but in the event the wettest we got was when the vicar liberally doused us with holy water in his blessing before we started.

To get us all to Daventry church and avoid leaving lots of cars parked there had been a logistical nightmare but Avril was more than up to the task as she instructed us as to who should drive where and which cars to leave at Hellidon. Anyway with cars duly waiting at the end point we left the church at Daventry, following the blessing and with the bells ringing in our ears we dropped through the graveyard and along the footpath and road to Welton church. The bells greeted us, a familiar theme during the day, as we briefly paused before tackling the walk over fields to Ashby St Ledgers church. At this point there were about twenty of us but this varied during the day as we gained people at each stop.

For me and I suspect many others, the highlight of the day was entering the cool, shady, church to the wonderful aroma of bacon. We were offered fantastic sausage and

bacon baps by the good folk of the church. During the day we were joined by different people who had elected to do different parts of the walk but if you intend joining us another year make sure to include this church! The advert says that "red bull gives you wings" but, let me tell you, bacon butties give you legs and we fair romped out of the village and over the hill to Braunston. Wonderful views on this bit as we climbed steadily into the village to get to the church and the sound of the bells pealing out to greet us

We sat on the wall outside the church and after a half an hour rest, picnic and drink we set off again. By now we had gained our youngest member a toddler whose Mum had brought the push chair. The ad for the walk had said "all ages welcome" and we ranged from 3 to somewhere in the 70s. A great group of experienced walkers and first timers. Fantastic spirit! We had also gained three dogs along with Clare, the vicar of Braunston and Ashby St Ledgers. The dogs romped over the fields enjoying their freedom only pausing to be manhandled in an undignified manner over awkward stiles. We walked up Old Road and across fields to join the bridle way over to Staverton. In the distant haze we could make out the Charwelton radio mast which stands above and behind our final destination, Hellidon.

We climbed the steep hill up to Staverton village pausing at the top to admire the views over the fields back to Braunston church spire and mill and then trudged on to the church, a welcome drink, a pause in the cool church and of course the wonderful sound of the bells.

After an all too short rest and a prayer from he vicar for the people in the group and ven one for the three dogs we set off again out of the village and across fields towards he magnificent old railway viaduct at Catesby. We were all lagging a bit by now. Exept for Philip of course who strode out in is usual style to make an impromptu visit to he viaduct. We passed lots of sheep in the elds and sadly what we took for a dead lamb lying by a water trough when to our surprise, : suddenly woke from its slumbers and shot ff bleating for its Mum who had left it to end for itself! We arrived at Catesby a little ite and then took the small lane up into Iellidon and up through the beautiful old

village to the church where the ladies had laid on a superb tea. By now many of our gallant band were gasping for a cuppa and it did not disappoint. Judging by the groaning table weighed down with fantastic sandwiches and delicious homemade cakes we probably need to do this same walk everyday for at least a week to eat it all!! As we enjoyed our tea the clouds were building and it only rained when we were safely home after a fantastic day.



Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 17/05/2008 Stamford Reservoir to Sibbertoft and Back (approx 12 miles)

line hardy souls set out on this walk ith the weather threatening rain fter all the glorious sunshine we had ad in the past week. Anyway we met p in the village and drove to our arting point, the car park at camford Reservoir. Four of our oup had agreed to meet us at the r park but there was no sign of em when we arrived as they had ne to another car park, not shown 1 the map, so after a brief journey king one of the cars we were united and ready to start walking! an was mistakenly wearing Avril's cket which was several sizes too nall for him. He normally wears rters but the less said about that e better. We followed the road wards Welford until we reached e Grand Union Canal and joined e towpath for a half a mile or so d then turned left away from the nal on a path that passes Sybold inney and climbs steadily up hill join Hall Lane, a bridle way from elford to North Kilworth. We ned right and followed Hall Lane wn to Welford. Passing the autiful old church we dropped wn hill admiring some animal vings on an old tree stump on the y, then crossed the main road

after viewing an old, but now closed pub, with the Phipps and Co brewery sign painted on the wall along with the name of the pub, now indistinct. Walking by the original old ford at Welford we joined the road and soon turned left on a path marked Reservoir Way and Jurassic Way. This is yet another part of that long distance path, that goes through Braunston and leads from Banbury all the way to Stamford in Lincolnshire, 88 miles in all.

Walking alongside the reservoir we passed many anglers, until we reached a causeway that took us across the reservoir and then leads over fields with the medieval village of Old Sulby. In 1448 this was enclosed by the Abbot of Sulby who no longer needed the labourers who lived there. It is now just a few well defined humps in the fields and would be interesting from the air or as a subject on Time Team. We also passed the site of the magnificent old Sulby Hall which was built in 1795 and sadly demolished in 1952. Our path was well signposted over fields until we reached the old village of Sibbertoft and our welcome lunch stop at the Red Lion. This is a great old pub and the food and beer and

welcome were all wonderful. I don't want to be a bore but it is yet another highly recommended watering hole. The Timothy Taylor Landlord bitter was superb.

Up until this point the rain had largely held off but predictably it caught us on the way over fields after the pub stop. The path, still marked Reservoir walk takes you over fields and drops down to a forest walk by Sulby Grange. The forest would have provided some shelter from the downpour but naturally the rain had stopped by the time we got there!! We crossed the road and dropped down to the River Avon. In addition to Jurassic Way, Reservoir Walk this was now Shakespeare's Avon Walk as we walked past some frisky bullocks along the Avon and back into Welford. 




