Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

'The earth is the Lord's and everything in it...' psalm 24:1

In this double issue I would just like to inform you of what is coming up. On October 5th we will be holding our Harvest Family Service at Braunston. We would love families and friends to come along as we celebrate God's goodness to us. In spite of a 'not so hot Summer' the Harvest crops have still been brought in- due to the hard work of our Farmers in this country and abroad.

The children's produce at School and the Church's produce will be auctioned off the next day in the School in the afternoon and at the Harvest Supper in the evening to provide money for 'Farm Africa'- a scheme called: 'Give Poverty the Boot!' This charity works directly with farmers in East and South Africa to find better, practical solutions to poverty-whether that's giving seeds, or an ox to a local farmer to plough their fields, or training a 'village vet' to treat basic diseases or training children at a school to plant and sow and keep chickens. This is in a land where

80% of Africans rely on the land for survival.

On the evening of the 5th October we will be having 'Harvest Songs of Praise' in the Church- and the collection from this will go towards 'Farm Crisis' – the helpline and support network available to Farmers in this Country- who because of past situations like 'foot and mouth' or present problems with mounting business costs are suffering from anxiety and stress.

Why not join us for a wonderful meal, good entertainment and the opportunity to buy some Harvest produce at the Harvest Supper on Monday 6th at 7pm at Braunston School? - tickets now available at the Post Office and Church!

As we move further into Autumn please do not forget to 'Remember'! On Sunday 2nd November we will be holding a Mourners Service at Holy Cross Church at 6.30pm for all those who have recently lost loved ones. The names of the loved ones will be read out and candles will be lit in memory of them. On November 9th – we will be remembering those who fought for our Country in past Wars and those who serve our Country

overseas at present. On Remembrance Day we have the British Legion 3pm Service at Braunston - in which uniformed organisations play a central part. (This year the British Legion Morning Service is at Ashby at 10.45am.) All Saints' Church's Patronal also falls in November on Saturday 1st at 7.30pm- to which you are warmly invited.

Please also remember you are always welcome to join us for worship. The main Sunday Service is at 11am every Sunday with Family service on the second Sunday. The 'All Saints Kids Club' (Sunday School) runs on all Sundays, apart from when there is Family Service. You are also warmly invited to Evensong on the First Sunday, or the 8am Sunday Holy Communion Service or Midweek Communion on Wednesdays at 10.30am.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support ensuring the success of The Braunston Show. After a wet summer and a particularly wet and windy week prior to the show all exhibitors went that extra mile to fill the village hall, once again, with a wonderful selection of exhibits to show off the many talents of villagers.

Perhaps the poor summer weather was the reason behind the increased number of contributions to the Home Produce, Handicraft, Junior and Senior sections of the Show. If you were not there this year, and you found it frustrating being indoors remember to look at the schedule next year to find great ideas to occupy all members of your family.

This year the BVGA introduced three new ideas to the show. The first was to encourage people to enter the show who have not entered before. The Manor of Fawcliff

Following the death of Edward the Confessor on January 3rd 1066, Harold became the last Saxon King under Danish Rule. A Saxon named Sawin, held land at Fawclive, and one named Tori held the hamlet of Braunston. The small hamlet of Fawclive stood at the bottom of a steep hill between Barby and Braunston. Sawin had a splendid house at the south-west corner of the hamlet. The house was surrounded by a deep ditch. The small wooden houses of the hamlet stood on raised platforms. Cattle and sheep would graze in the surrounding pastures.

As we descend the hill on the road from Barby, we take a sharp left turn. We have passed around the village of Fawcliff, close to the moated manor house and the small houses of nine and a half centuries ago. We can imagine those Saxon forebears, the men labouring in the fields, the women and children herding cattle on Cleves Hill, getting water from the stream on the east side of the village, or collecting kindling for their fires on Braunston Cleves.

In 1066 their world changed. The Saxon King died on October 14th, shot in the eye by an arrow while fighting the Normans on the long hill of Senlac William the Conqueror ascended the throne of England. And with William came the Norman Knights. Land was given to these followers over the length and breadth of England. From 1200 to 1508 the family of De Ros held the Manor of Braunston.

The village of Fawcliff is believed to have been part of the 11th century manor of William Trusbott (or de Trusbut). William Trusbott married Albreda de Harecourt, daughter of Roese and Rollo de Harecourt. The estate at Braunston was assigned to Roese, and Albreda became possessed in the right of her mother's lands in Braunston.

William Trusbott and Albreda had three sons and three daughters. The three sons died without issue, and the estate was divided between the three sisters. The settlement of Fawcliff passed to the third sister, Agatha Meinfelin. Agatha left the village to Delapre Abbey in Northampton.

So the story of Fawcliff passes into obscurity. When and why the village was deserted is unknown. Pause at the top of the hill above Fawcliff and see a splendid view across the flat plain of Warwickshire to the line of distant hills, marking the shores of Harrison's Lake of 8,000 years ago.

If you have the good fortune to be at Fawcliff on a winter's day, with light snow on the ground and a bright sun shining from the west, you will see the outline of the houses of Fawcliff and the deep ditch around the manor house. But, with the setting of the sun and a thaw in the wind, it will all disappear, just as the village of Fawcliff became deserted and disappeared.





Braunston Walkers - Wizard Welsh Walking Weekend in the Wye Valley 19/9 to 21/9/2008

This was our first attempt at a walking weekend away and as you will see it was a success and, hopefully the first of many to come! Eleven of us stayed at The Seven Stars Guesthouse in Hay on Wye for a fun filled weekend. We started on Friday by driving to the old town of Kington and then the walkers set off up a steep hill, thankfully by car, to walk a short circuit on the beautiful slopes of Hergest Ridge. The non walking ladies had a perambulation around the tiny shops in the town and apparently stopped at every teashop for tea and cakes whilst we struggled up and over the over the hill on Offas Dyke footpath, a common theme of our walks in the area (Offas Dyke I mean, not the struggle, although come to think of it....) You may of heard of Hergest Ridge as it was the name of a number one record album produced by Mike Oldfield who also made the record album Tubular Bells back in the seventies (my Dad told me about it) He apparently had a rural retreat nearby. It is a beautiful spot and since the weather was so good the views from the top were magnificent. After a four mile walk designed to get us ready for the big push on the Saturday we were ready for lunch and went back to The Swan in Kington for sandwiches and a pint of the good local beer, Butty Bach, Super!

We arrived at the Seven Stars and checked in and had a general browse around the Hay on Wye bookshops and a search around the charity shops to buy cheap swimwear to take advantage of the pool and sauna at the guest house and in the evening all eleven of us met up for dinner in the Blue Boar pub. A very pleasant place and excellent food and beer. In the morning after an award winning fry up the magnificent seven walkers set off in the car to drive over the hills to the beautiful Llantony Priory, our staring point. The

morning mist was lying in the valleys as we drove over the gospel pass. A magnificent sight. Donning boots we set off past the old priory and up a seriously steep, cardiac arrest type of hill along the Beacons Way. Huffing and puffing we occasionally paused to catch our breath and to use the defibrillator! Coming down the narrow path were horses and riders with the horses picking their way gingerly down whilst the riders hung on for dear life looking back over the valley from the dizzy heights. I noticed that those of us that had indulged in the full Seven Stars breakfast eggs bacon black pudding sausage etc etc were now lagging behind a bit. I was one of them but I knew that later in the day I would be glad of this massive calorie intake. We made it to the top at about 550 metres above sea level where Terry came to the rescue again with sweets. We were now back on Offas Dyke footpath looking down on the top of passing buzzards to the distant priory far below in the valley. We walked along the ridge looking in vain for what was marked on the map as a "pile of stones" This is also the border between England and Wales. The views were fantastic as we continued walking but not finding the stones. We turned off the path on our right and started a steep descent through the tufts of gorse eventually blundering through the undergrowth to rejoin our path on the English side of the ridge into the Olchon Valley below the next high ridge known as the Cats Back. We climbed to Blackhill farm and met a small road which leads uphill again!! By now we were seriously tired, in need of sustenance but still not at our lunch stop, White Haywood Farm. We soon started to drop down hill along increasingly muddy tracks to reached the derelict Coed Farm and then through a field past some inquisitive horses and some

woodland until we reached a farm. Thankfully this turned out to be our lunch stop although if it hadn't been we would of asked them to prepare our lunch since we were getting desperate. The lovely lady, Pauline Goodwin, who runs this delightful place was ready in anticipation and had cooled the beer especially for us. It is a lovely 400 year old barn serving fantastic food and drink, a real tonic for weary walkers and highly recommended if you are ever in the area. We were made extremely welcome and almost decided to stay there for the rest of the weekend but our non walking ladies were waiting at home so reluctantly we donned our boots again and set off at first along a gently rising road but then turning left up the aptly named Hill Road with muscles screaming and lungs complaining. After this our track, a combination of streams, mud and damp stones in a wooded tunnel lead us back parallel with the brooding ridge of Black Hill. We needed to pick up the Offas Dyke path for home below Hay Bluff at 677 metres and knew we had to reach the end of the ridge for this but it seemed that every glimpse through the trees showed it getting no closer. We passed fords and waterfalls and eventually burst out of this wooded tunnel and on up hill again to meet Offas Dyke. We finally could see a dense woodland called Tack Wood that stands between us and Hay on Wye and we wearily stumbled along through fields and downhill to eventually reach the welcome sight of our guesthouse and the Braunston Ladies (non walking division) who had been anxiously waiting our return. After an all to brief wash and no rest we walked the 25 yards or so to The Three Tuns pub who had been waiting for us an hour earlier for dinner and some more Butty Bach beer. Over dinner the ladies told us all about their day visiting the church and generally enjoying their stay in Hay. I think next time I might stay with them but seriously I would not have

missed this magnificent sixteen mile walk for anything!

The walkers all slept very well on the Saturday night and after vet another fantastic breakfast we checked out and set off to drive to Llantony Priory again to fetch the cars left the day before. We had a closer look around the Priory that Henry the eighth had knocked about a bit before taking a delightful drive to Gladestry where we had a short riverside stroll along the Wye and then finishing the weekend at The River Café a fantastic place run by an Italian family next to the bridge over the river. This weekend was a success and we have to thank Philip and hope his blisters have healed, now that we have forgiven him for the long walk on the Saturday. Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy monthly rambles. They are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery. Remember you don't have to do the full walk some of our members arrange pick ups from the pub stop halfway, normally 5 or 6 miles. Please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384. Paul Michel Beechey

My name is Dale and I am attempting to trace a lost relative of mine whom I believe once lived in your village. My family, I assume like many in the village, were from the Canal Boat Community.

On the 13th February 1951 my Great-Grandmother, Sarah Ellen Beechey (who was often called Sally), gave birth to a baby whom she named Paul Michel Beechey. However Sarah suffered with epilepsy and, unable to stay on the boat with her condition, the decision was taken that she was sent to live in a hospital on land and unfortunately was never seen by her family again, leaving my Grandmother Patricia and Paul behind. Given that she was two years older and already knew her family, Sarah's parents, Abel and Nellie Beechey kept Patricia, however hadn't the room on the boat for Paul and sent him to live with someone living in the village, which was the last known contact with him.

I am now eager to trace Paul, who would be 57 years old, in the hopes of filling in the gaps of his childhood and introducing him to a sister he possibly doesn't know he has. I know that he was informally given away, as no adoption is registered for him on his birth entry, so whatever name he may go by now (dependant on if he adopted the family name of his new family), he will have had to have obtained and therefore seen his Birth Certificate by now in today's society to obtain a Passport, Driving Licence etc.




