over the next few weeks and also of course the joy of Easter. Please try and find some time in this month's busy activity to come and worship. 'The children friendly' events include the Palm Sunday walk to Church, the Easter Saturday children's workshop in the Village Hall, and the Easter Day Holy Communion in Church, with egg hunt for the children. An interview with Canon Michael Webber in the March edition of Team Talk

Rev Liz: We are looking forward to you coming to the Team Ministry. Tell us something about yourself and your family.

Canon Michael: I was brought up in Kent, Beckenham then Sevenoaks and went to Manchester University, where I studied Theology. I stayed on to do an M.A. was a postman for a year and then trained to be a priest at Cuddesdon College, Oxford. I was a Curate at Caterham, where I met my wife, Felicity, who is a Landscape architect. We then moved to Kidbrooke in south London where I was a Team Vicar on a housing estate. Our two children, Rosalind and Justin were born there. Then in 1987 we moved to Earls Barton and for seven years I was also Rural Dean of Wellingborough.

Rev Claire: Have you always gone to church, who or what has helped you in your faith journey?

Michael: Both my parents went to church and I enjoyed being part of the Church family at Norwood in south London. My growth in faith was a gradual process though I have felt times of being called- a quiet nagging call, not something dramatic . Many people have helped me on my faith journey but buildings have also played a part. The church where I grew up had a wonderful atmosphere of worship.

Liz: I imagine you will find working in Daventry to be very different to working in a village like Earls Barton.

Michael: Yes in some ways, but Earls Barton is a large village or small town of almost 6,000 people. Of course Daventry is much larger but my work as a priest will not I think be very different.

Claire: Do you think Vicars should concentrate on those who come regularly to church?

Michael: I think we should take an interest in everybody. At Earls Barton I have spent much time with the whole community especially over baptisms, weddings and funerals. At Christmas we held an outdoor carol service which was attended by about 3,000 people. I helped to organise a summer Playscheme for the children of Earls Barton.

Liz: How do you feel about joining a Team Ministry?

Michael: I am really looking forward to joining the Team. I helped set up a Team Ministry in Kidbrooke some years ago and in Earls Barton I have set up the Leadership Team, which consists of Lay Pastoral Ministers, Readers, 4 Wardens and the clergy. The Lay Pastoral Ministers help with pastoral work and I hope that ministry may be encouraged in the Daventry team.

Claire: I agree. We have 3 Readers in the team here, have you had much experience of working with Readers?

Michael: Yes I used to be the sub warden of Readers and helped to put together the present training programme in the diocese. We have 2 Readers in training at present.

Liz: What are your immediate hopes and plans?

Michael: Well first to get to know people and to do a lot of listening. There are a number of good things going on at Holy Cross and in the wider team which I hope with others to build on. I am also keen to see the work with children and families develop at Holy Cross and am pleased to hear that planning has started for a new Sunday club.

Let the brass band play tiddly om pom pom. Please come to a Celebration of the efforts that have provided Braunston Jettty Field Pocket Park. Sunday 14th June from 2 to 5 p.m. Yes: Daventry Brass Band will be playing, Play Rangers from the Country Park will have some games for the youngsters, you can walk round with our new guide leaflet, there will be sowing kits to help seed new flowers in the field [well sourced form BTCV] and there will be displays and other activities. Please bring your own picnics, tables, awnings, clothes and the like: a prize for the best-dressed picnic ensemble. Probably better if there are no barbecues. An old fashioned village picnic day - and all the better for that.

But before then - we are completing discussions about Conservation Grazing on the field. In order to bring back the flower meadow that would once have existed in the field we need to graze the vegetation with animals on a managed process. This chews back the coarse grasses and provides better patches for flower seeds to get a hold. The animals' feet press seeds into the ground and rejuvenation can begin. This will build on the preparatory work of the last few years of mowing and preserving the variety of grasses and flowers already there. We hope to use the team who have been working with Daventry Country Park to graze a flock of small rare-breed horned sheep. Numbers will change over the months with the management process. But there will be many more times when sheep are on the field than heretofore. We realise that this will mean us asking dog walkers and groups to be aware of the sheep and to respect their safety.

Please keep dogs under control when sheep are in the field. I think this is what our notice says that has been on display several times already. There should be room for dogs and sheep in this large field but please keep your dog on a lead if he/she is in a lively mood.



Braunston Walkers -Braunston Walkers Saturday 14/03/2009 Upper Boddington to Priors Marston and Back (circa 9 miles)

At my instigation the group had agreed to bring this walk forward a week and I was a bit concerned that the weather may have turned out bad but it was a brilliant sunny Spring morning when ten of us met up at the village hall and then drove over to Upper Boddington. I wouldn't like to bet on the weather next Saturday when we should have been walking! Wonderfull sunshine and a keen cold wind gave us ideal conditions for the walk. This is a really great ramble through some spectacular scenery and so close to home. Leaving the cars we set off towards the delightful old village and then turned left after skirting the playing field, up a narrow footpath which was extremely boggy and soon messed up those lovely clean new boots! Our path lead over some ploughed fields steadily rising and where possible we walked round fields rather than the designated path since we would have sunk without trace had we gone through the thick clay. The path leads up to a small pond in a copse and on the map it shows a building but that has long since vanished. Just after the phantom building we arrived at a hedgerow and turned left to reach a path along the county boundary between our very own Northants and Warwickshire. There are fabulous views over open country back towards Upper Boddington from here.

The group turned right along the path here and then in a few yards we turned left to walk over to Berryhill Farm.

The views from here are really fantastic taking in the white sails of Napton windmill sparkling in the sun over to the right and extending over past Southam then distant Coventry and Leamington and on over the Warwickshire plain. We walked left around the old farmstead to be greeted with even more spectacular views over to Bishops Itchington and panning left over to the Burton Dasset Hills. Immediately in front of us was the moated Stoneton Manor and to its left the site of it's medieval village. It is really worth walking up to the farm just for the views even if the whole walk is a little too far.

We were in high spirits as the wind continued to make eyes water as we dropped down Berry Hill (188 metres above sea level) down to meet the road. We turned right along the road for a few yards before turning onto the road to Stoneton Manor. On our right was a huge lake but someone had pulled the plug out and it was little more than a huge muddy puddle. At the end of this road our path turned right and took us down past another farm and to the Oxford Canal where we turned right along the towpath with it's banks strewn with violets turning their heads towards the warm sun. All the way we had seen buds on the bushes emerging to take a tentative look as if expecting some more snow before the Spring really gets going. We left the towpath at the next bridge and follwed a path over ancient ridge and furrow fields and on up a small valley where the

farmer had recently created a pond. Eventually the path lead out at the road and we turned right to walk into Priors Hardwick Philip was so looking forward to lunch at this stage that he had told everyone we were nearly there forgetting that lunch was not till Priors Marston. Anyway we turned left to admire the beautiful old village with its old church and stone buildings and passing the Butcher Arms with stomachs rumbling we soon reached the Tjunction where we turned right for a few yards before taking a footpath on the left over several fields to eventually emerge in yet another beautiful old stone village, Priors Marston and more importantly our lunch stop at The Holly Bush. We enjoyed our sandwiches and pints of Old Hookey but all too soon it was time to don our muddy boots and set off out of the village on the Byfield Road. The ridge on our left was one that we had walked on another occasion but we followed the road for a haifa mile or so and then turned onto a footpath over towards Grange Farm. We passed lots of new born lambs gambolling in the fields and enjoyoing the sunshine with anxious ewes checking us out. This area is a popular area for shooting and we found lots of clays that were intact so I am guessing that the shooters are not very good at it! After skirting the farm our path went over several fields. During the recce for this walk we had watched in awe as two hares ran at blistering speeds around the fields away from us. Alas there were none today prompting some wag to say "hare today gone tomorrow"

As if sensing our disappointment at this lack of wild life a muntjack deer appeared along the hedgerow before dis-

solving into the bushes like a ghost. The last field before Upper Boddington was a steep climb and we paused at the top. One to catch our breath and two to look back over the valley. We finally arrived at a road and turned left to get to the village before turning right through the village and emerging back at the village hall. This is a fabulous walk and well worth the effort.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy walking. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery. Remember you don't have to do the full walk some of our members arrange pick ups from the pub stop halfway, normally 5 or 6 miles.






