Home energy efficiency project

Daventry District Council has been awarded funding from Central Government to help households in the District to reduce their fuel bills. The 100% grants will pay for the installation of renewable energy systems such as solar panels, new types of heating systems such as heat pumps or insulation measures such as solid wall insulation. Applicants must be from the private housing sector and claiming a means-tested benefit.

We are targeting the money at areas off the gas mains and want to start with Braunston, as one of the larger villages in the district. We are aiming to do a targeted mailout and hopefully host a DASH event.

Hadim lived in a SFH (Small Family Home) for eight years after suffering traumatic events that he still does not feel able to talk about. However, he says that being in the Home saved him and made him the upstanding person he is today. He now works as a rickshaw driver and has a family of his own.

Abdul was living on the streets for two years and spent time in an Internally Displaced Persons Camp before our social workers found him. He spent four years in a SFH until we were able to trace his mother. Their reunion was a very emotional occasion.

Sixteen year old Khamisa was separated from her family for eight years and spent the first year living alone in an Internally Displaced Persons Camp. She came to live in a SFH seven years ago and last year we found her mother and sister in Kenana. Khamisa's sister recognised her immediately and her mother was overjoyed to see her again. Khamisa said she did not mind that her family was very poor, she was just happy to be back with them



Braunston Walkers - Saturday 18/3/2009 Calcutt Marina (well almost) circa 12 miles

Thirteen of us set off to drive to Flecknoe, our starting point for the walk. It was a beautiful sunny spring day with a nice cool breeze which would prove to be handy on some steep hills. We parked near Flecknoe Farm and then walked through the village to emerge just past the smart touring caravan site and onto field paths leading over Bush Hill and gradually descending till we reached the main A425 Daventry to Southam road. Taking care crossing the road we entered a farm track which leads to Upper Shuckburgh. Looking up towards the old Shuckburgh Hall we spotted the herd of deer and the white hart which has had many pubs named after it as well as a football stadium!

After a half or mile or so we turned right to enter the grounds of Shuckburgh Hall and walked past Home Farm and up on our right we could see the beautiful old church standing on a hill next to the hall. At this point our path exited the deer park and we climbed the aptly named Long Hill puffing and gasping for breath to reach the highest point of Beacon Hill with a well and trig point at 205 metres. I know its not Everest but trust me it felt like it!

Our struggles paid off for the views from the top are magnificent stretching from Daventy past Staverton across to Hellidon and over the Warwickshire countryside to Napton on the Hill. (another hill!!) We paused for breath and

gratefully ate Brian's sweets taking in the fabulous view. Sheep and small lambs bleated all round us celebrating the fine Spring weather. There is a reservoir up here and below an old mill which was used to pump the water. After an all to brief rest we set off again down with trees on our right of Old Fox Covert before dropping down to meet the old gated road between Shuckburgh and Priors Marston. This road is lined with Horse Chestnut trees planted to celebrate Queen Victoria diamond jubilee and the tree blossoms are alternatively white and pink to commemorate that famous occasion. We crossed the road and continued our descent past Halls Barn Farm and on towards Napton. Across the valley we could see a steep green hill up to the village which was to be our next destination. Just what we needed another steep hill!!

At the top of the grassy hill in the village we entered a small lane lined with a few peeking Bluebells to walk even higher up until we reached the old church which stands on top of the hill. At the end of this high ground we could see the old windmill glinting in the sun. Our path, fortunately, goes steeply down hill from here and entering the last field before the main A425 road we saw Alpacas, Buffalo and, believe or not. Emus but no Rod Hull. Someone said imagine eating a drumstick of that which was a little insensitive. We crossed the main road and walked towards Southam

and past the Bridge Inn before taking a footpath of to the right which crosses fields before reaching Stockton our lunch stop. We could see the village in the distance and this part of the walk is about 1 and half miles but seems much further after the hills we had done in the morning. We passed New Zealand Farm and eventually entered Stockton by it's old church and shortly after that we reached The Crown pub where we enjoyed quaffing pints of Ansells bitter and a great meal. Alan and Avril met us at the pub so fifteen of us sat down and enjoyed the lunch. This is a great old English pub and the food is reasonably priced and delicious. Highly recommended! Several hours after we had sat down at the pub and after the communal tasting of a treacle rolly poly pudding we dragged our tired old bodies out and set off for the return walk.

We left the village and the path takes you over the football field where a match was in progress before passing some cricketers practicing in the nets we emerged to cross Station Road and again entered a field path to meet a small road where we turned right and then left via a field full of sheep to cross a disused railway and over the canal at the Tomlow Bridge. Looking down into the canal we spotted a box with some writing on the top, floating in the canal and using Ian's digital camera and a nifty zoom lens we were able to read that this was a water vole station. Since they can't read I am not sure how the water voles would know it was a station for them?

Our path followed a road with the site of the medieval village of Caldcote on our left and then we recrossed the old railway track past Ventnor Farm at about the closest we were to get to Calcutt Marina. We took a bridle way over to Shuckburgh village with its ornate old church and after a short walk on the canal towpath, joined a footpath which runs alongside the canal. It was with some dread that we realized we had to climb the other side of Bush Hill to get back to Flecknoe but it was not too steep and we soon made it back to the cars to get home for a welcome cuppa. This really is a super walk through stunning scenery and as usual a great bunch of people to walk with.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy walking. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery.




