

Vicar's Letter

Dear all,

Probably by the time this BVN reaches you the children will be getting ready to go back to School, and life will be getting back to a more familiar routine. I hope all of you were able to have some time to rest and catch up with family and friends over the Summer- and that you are now feeling more refreshed and re-energised.

This morning I went for an early morning walk with my dog Millie. Feeling a bit weary we sat down in the corn field- the sun was just warming up and I was thinking that there is no better place to be than England when the sun is shining! As we sat in the corn field we heard the sound of tractors and combine harvestors driving up and down the fields. This year the fields are looking more healthy than last and the garden has had an abundant crop of

beans, and courgettes, onions and tomatoes. The combination of rain and sun this Summer has all contributed!

I think back to an early morning walk about 14 years ago- this time in a small village in Zambia. As Support Officer for VMM (The Volunteer Missionary Movement) I was out visiting one of our volunteers- a nurse. The morning walk took me to children with distended tummies. The mango harvest had failed for that year- it was far too hot and dry. The main meal I had at the Nurse volunteer's house was rice and tomatoes- and she was able to shop more widely than her neighbours. Goodness knows what the local person was eating-but the distended tummies were showing it wasn't very much.

We shouldn't beat ourselves up for having so much choice and so much to buy in our shops – but Harvest time is a time to say thankyou and to remember that there are a lot of people far worse off than ourselves. That's why as well as praising God at All Saints for another Harvest brought home- and thanking God for the farmers and producers who work around the clock to provide for us- we also stop to think about those who are less fortunate. We try to support a charity every year- and this year we would like all the money

from the proceeds that Church and School gather in to go towards helping Hope and Homes. The Hope and Homes Harvest project is supplying food to those who are quite literally hungry- and need food for today. And giving seeds and tools to families who can plan for food for tomorrow. The more we give- the more they will receive- so please do support us.

There is a Harvest Service at 11am on Sunday 4th October and a Harvest Supper on Monday 5th, where traditionally we have an Auction to sell off the food that has been given at Church and School. The money given will go towards helping children and families in Africa so that they have a reason to be thankful too! Please do give generously!

I'm sure I'm echoing the thoughts of a lot of us in extending a particularly warm welcome in this September edition of the BVN to Sue Rigby who joins us this month as the new Headteacher of Braunston School. We wish her and all the staff and children well at the beginning of this new School Term.







Braunston Walkers - Saturday 15/8/2009

This splendid walk takes in an area just north of Market Harborough around the villages known as The Langtons of Leicestershire. It includes super views and a fantastic pub serving a locally made ale, Caudle Bitter which used to be brewed at the pub itself but is now brewed on a local farm and in my top ten beers it would figure at number 2. High praise indeed but more later...

We set off for the drive to the Langtons but were stymied when it appeared that everyone and his Uncle wanted to visit Market Harborough at the same time we wanted to pass through. Fortunately for us Carol knows the area and took us on a tour via Foxton to our starting point at the small hamlet of Stonton Wyville. Eleven of us set with a feel of rain in the air which dried up as we started to walk. We followed the small road out of the hamlet up to a T junction and then joined a bridle way which is part of The Midshire Way Our footpath left the bridle way on the left and started a short but steep ascent up to the top of the hill named Caudle at 147 metres. The views are magnificent from here and we paused to enjoy them. At least that was our excuse for the frequent and ever longer stops on the way uphill.

By now the sun was out and with a stiff and cooling breeze we continued along the top of the hill. Our normal leader, Philip, had selfishly gone on holiday leaving me in charge and I very soon went wrong for the first time by walking down hill and then, realizing my mistake, back uphill again. As the group enjoyed this aimless wandering so

much I did it several times during the day narrowly avoiding huge combine harvesters but finally finding the right track. Come back Philip all is forgiven was the cry from the weary group!

We passed a deep indentation on top of the hill shown on the map as a disused pit before Mavis decided to try some impromptu potholing. Fortunately she was fine after stepping into a hole on her bad leg. The hole was as deep as her stick and could have been a real disaster. We finally reached the Thorpe Langton Road and walked for a few yards before turning right by Welham church and a fabulous display of Hollyhocks along the narrow Bowden Road which was thankfully traffic less. It was getting very hot as we walked past a fishing lake on our left and immediately turned right onto a muddy tree lined path crossing several fields and passing lots of inquisitive cattle to emerge at Bowden Road and then turned right towards Thorpe Langton before taking a footpath left with stiles and lots of barbed wire over seven fields and after yet another slight deviation we entered the village at East Langton and our welcome pub stop at The Bell Inn.

What can I say, the welcome, the Beer (2nd only to Donnington Ale in the Cotswolds and shortly ahead of Black Sheep in my view) and tasty ciabattas and fabulous chips which we had ordered earlier and was being served even before all the group had ordered their drinks were all great. It was all absolutely fantastic and is highly recommended. The publican has a great sense of humour and served a mean

personalized sticky toffee pudding for Bharat with 11 spoons, ice cream and custard! Wonderful!!.

Another reluctant leaving as we set off past the village cricket match and then onto a field path where we were joined by a horse who had a taste for Foxes Aniseed sweets that Terry had handed out. We finally persuaded him that he couldn't come with us and continued up to a road which we crossed and then started along a road towards Church Langton for a short way before taking another field path on our left which emerges on the road to Melton Mowbray. We crossed this road and entered a path through Manor Farm with lots of horses and a field full of shaggy Highland cattle with huge horns gazing at the group. Our path continued downhill and then right to emerge in the village of Tur Langton. Here we entered a small lane and joined field paths past where Philip had rescued a goat from the fence during our wet recce and on over rolling fields where we picked some wild mushrooms bigger than my hat to arrive back at the cars via some medieval fish ponds. This really is a super walk through some beautiful scenery.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy walking. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery.
