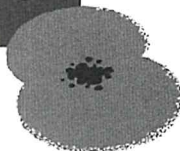
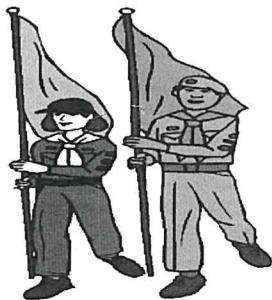

Dear friends,

Having just got back from Iona I picked up a tea towel for my parents with this Celtic Prayer on it:

Deep peace of the running waves to you.

Deep peace of the flowing air to you.

Deep peace of the quiet earth to you.

Deep peace of the shining stars to you.

Deep peace of the Son of peace to you.

The person who wrote this obviously found his or her peace in Creation, and walking in nature. Where do you find peace? I'm sure if you have children it can be difficult! But when they are playing happily there is that inner peace which is quite special.

In our busy world it can be hard to find peace, especially as we receive news of the war in Afghanistan and in our own personal lives

experience troubles. Strife without and within ourselves can cause stress and anxiety.

On Remembrance Day we will be thinking not only of the men and women who laid down their lives for World peace- the most amazing sacrifice- which is still hard to comprehend. But in the morning All Age Service we will be thinking about where we find peace and how we celebrate it- in ourselves, and between ourselves. 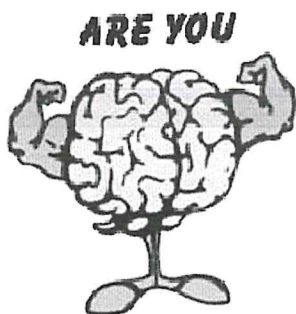

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD – SHOE BOX APPEAL

Braunston Walkers -Saturday 17/10/2009

Grendon -Coggenhoe and the River Nene (8 miles)

This walk takes in a magnificent old stately home, a lovely old stone church above the Nene valley and finishes with a walk along a stretch of the old river. It is a great walk with lots of interest along the way.

Eight of us met up at the village hall and after a sneaky look at the interesting old photos of Braunston on display in the hall, courtesy of the history society and a quick game of conkers, we set off to drive to our starting point at Grendon. This is an old Northamptonshire stone village on the borders of Buckinghamshire and Bedfordshire perched up above the River Nene. It was once owned by Judith, the niece of William the Conqueror. I know that sounds like I just made it up but its true. I got it from Wilkepedia! We left the village via a footpath opposite the old church and over the fields in front of us we could see Castle Ashby house. It is the ancestral home of the 7th Marquess of Northampton and is still privately owned and available for weddings and bar mitzvahs etc. There are 200 acres of beautiful parkland designed by Capability Brown (he was a busy guy!!) Apparently it is built on the site of a 13th century castle and the land was granted to the family by Henry V111. On the map there is a two mile long tree lined drive which dates back to 1695. We strolled over fields admiring the house and entered Castle Ashby village.

We had a quick look around at a collection of small shops and a café in a courtyard next to the old house, before walking out on the road towards our next stop the tiny village of Whiston. After a climb uphill avoiding speeding Range Rovers we found a footpath on our right and set off through fields to reach Whiston Church, St Mary Magdelene.

This is a fantastic old building built by Antony Catesby in 1534 although there had been a church on this site since 1180. Local legend says that the costs of the building so drained Antony Catesby that he had to sell his flock of sheep in order to purchase the bells. Rumour has it that he said to his wife on hearing the bells "can you hear my lambs bleating." The tower has stripes of darker Northampton stone and some fantastic gargoyles and an interesting old crypt in the graveyard. It is well worth a visit. We paused to admire the fantastic views over the River Nene valley and the other side of the valley to Earl's Barton with its Saxon church. We and walked down the lane into the tiny village, turned right on the road and then took a path over the fields to rejoin the Whiston Road for a short while before taking another field path towards Coggenhoe. On our way we passed Roe Farm with a magnificent old clock face standing abandoned amongst an old rubbish pile. Our path lead us along what had been a hedgerow and on uphill to reach Coggenhoe village and our welcome lunch stop at The Royal Oak. Most unusually we had not had a chance to recce this pub and from the outside it did not look promising but once we were settled down to pints of foaming Black Sheep ale and delicious toasted Chiabattas it began to look better and better. After an all too short lunch break we set off through the old stone village towards the church and joined a small field path clearly signposted The Nene Way. This footpath is 110 miles long stretching from Badby to Sutton Bridge in Lincolnshire where the river flows out into the wash just west of Kings Lynn. We have done the Badby end of this walk in one of our previous walks and you

could jump over the narrow river but at Coggenhoe it is already a wide navigable river and we paused to admire it at the old mill house. This is a lovely spot and there are lots of well tended caravans on an island between the mill stream and the main river. Our path took us along the side of the river which meanders along through some lovely countryside. We were even rewarded with a fleeting glimpse of a bright blue Kingfisher crossing the river. We followed the riverside path until we reached a weir and the lock and passing this we crossed the river on an old footbridge and then continued on the north bank for several miles before emerging at the next lock then crossing river on a road bridge. Over to our left was the imposing tower of Whiston church guarding the river valley.



After a short bit of road walking we left on a footpath opposite The Gatehouse which is shown on the map as a pub but is an old railway station complete with carriages now used as a restaurant. Our path lead us on past Grendon lakes, a wetland area popular with anglers, and then we turned right on another

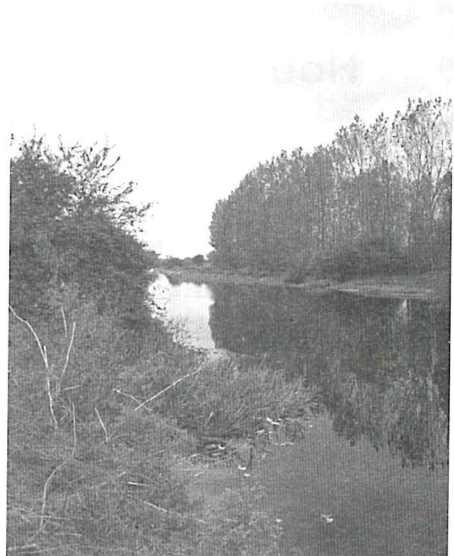
path over fields to lead us steeply up to Grendon Church and after several false trails on to our waiting cars. A wonderfully varied walk yet again!

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy walking. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery. Remember you don't have to do the full walk some of our members arrange pick ups from the pub stop halfway, normally 4 or 5 miles. Please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384. 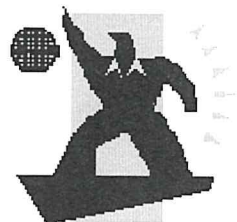

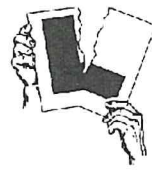
