Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

February is the month for 'lurv' and a lot of people on the evening of 14th February will be enjoying a candlelit meal with their loved one- or those new to the game bashfully offering a card with 'guess who? xxx

There are many legends surrounding St Valentine and the connection of this Saint with the celebration of lovers. One popular legend has it that that as a priest he continued to marry young couples even though Emperor Claudius forbade it. (Apparently Claudius thought that married soldiers weren't as good as single soldiers.) Another legend has it that, on the eve of his death, he penned a farewell note to the jailer's daughter, signing it, "From your Valentine." His love for God and concern for those around him led him to being matyred in 269 AD.

There is only one word for 'love' in the English Language. But of course in Greek there are different words: Eros (???? ér?s) is passionate love, or romantic love. Philia (????? philía), means friendship and it includes loyalty to friends, family, and community. Agap? (????? agáp?) in the New Testament refers to a total commitment or self-sacrificial love for the object loved. It may involve loving someone who is not necessarily lovely or loveable.

Though Eros love is enjoyed and to be celebrated, the relationships we enjoy daily probably reflect to some extent the other two types of love.

It is our custom during Lent to have an

evening to stop think and reflect. This year we intend to follow a course called: 'Better Together?' And we will be looking at different aspects of relationships; family relationships, relationships within the church, relating to strangers, broken relationships, and our relationship with God. Our 'guest speakers' for the evening will be Nicky Gumble (Minister at Holy Trinity Brompton and writer of Alpha) Jane Williams (Theologian and Archbishop Rowan's wife!) John Bell (Musician, Theologian and member of Iona Community)- they will be speaking on CD and then we can get going on how what they have said has or has not resonated with our own experience. Jesus said to his followers: 'Love one another as I have loved you'. The spirit of Christ helps us to live joyfully, and reach out. There will be moments when through Lent I realise I fall well short of

the mark, not offering philia or agape love. But our relationship with a God who is always more ready to forgive than I to say 'sorry' - helps me and I hope helps you -to get up, brush yourself down and start again. I've just been listening on Radio 4 to that popular song 'Lord of the dance' The composition of this piece evokes a picture of God who is fun, a friend, reaching out to us to join in the dance. Our Lord is totally irrepressible. Nothing will keep him down, 'he leaps up high'.

We are meeting every Wednesday night during Lent, starting on 28th February. Please come and join us for any or all of these evenings.

Meanwhile 'Happy Valentine's day'- and may you know and give 'love' on all sorts of levels this year.

A piece of Barcelona comes to Braunston Playing Field



More good news from Braunston Playing Field

Thanks to the financial support from Braunston Parish Council, Awards for All, The Horne Foundation, and Daventry Youth Forum, Braunston Playing Field Association will be doubling the size of the Arena hard play area, enabling competitive games and also installing a youth shelter. All that remains to be done is dot the 'I's and cross the T's for the work to commence.

Just before Christmas the hedge leading down to the playing field was blitzed by two skilled hedge layers. We now have a much neater and tidier hedge. The work revealed a very large lump of concrete (can anyone explain where it came from?), various bollards and a load of scrap metal. You can now have a glimpse of the repainted play equipment as you drive past.

Braunston Walkers - Saturday 21 January 2007 - Barby, Willoughby and back to Braunston (c. 8 Miles)

fter a week of devastating orms with winds of 80 mph and its of rain we awoke with some epidation to find the sky parkling blue and the sun nining. There was still a bit of ind but only enough to cool own a hot walker. We set off, eventeen intrepid hikers, on our rst walk in 2007, taking the arby Road. We circumnavigated ie first of many puddles. This ne spread right across the road saving only an extremely wet nd muddy bit of grass at the ide. We stomped on up the road nd past the S bend around the ite of the ancient Fawcliffe illage and up the steep and long ill with magnificent views over ne Warwickshire plain, to arby.

taying on the road we decided) walk through the village rather nan take the muddy path past the ld mill and lakes. Our route ontinued through the village and ust before the shop we branched ff left past old farms one of vhich had a heap of mangel vurzels ready to feed their cattle. lumming "I've got a brand new ombine harvester" we continued ast another farmyard and two lewly born, wet, lambs bleating or their mother who was lowhere to be seen. At the rossroad of paths we went icross to a field and ploughed our way through a quagmire in vhich our boots, trousers etc. vere tested as to their waterproof value. The fields were like a sponge in this area as we tried to avoid the worst mud and continued over stiles. We recalled a summer walk in the same field where Carol had handed out fresh cherries. This time it was Werthers old originals that we were handed out as we paused for breath looking up at a lonely trig point at 161 metres above sea level. We dropped down on field paths until we crossed a bridge over the Oxford Canal next to the prison at Onley then walked along the old railway before turning off under the railway and past a fishing lake then on more muddy fields to reach the A45. Braving the fast moving traffic we crossed the road and took the footpath diagonally over a ploughed field that brings you out by Willoughby cricket Club. Our pace quickened as we knew we were getting near our lunch pub stop. Walking into the village past the old duck pond we found a small path on our left. Thoughtfully concreted and taking us above the waterlogged fields and conveniently coming out right next to The Rose pub. Removing the by now disgusting muddy footwear we stepped into the warm and inviting pub. The beer was superb and the food we

all thought was wonderful. I had a fish finger sandwich which was the best, none of your frozen preformed who knows what kind of fish but a fantastic piece of fresh battered fish between two slices of crusty bread. It was so good I took the family back on Sunday for a magnificent roast beef dinner. It did not disappoint! Highly recommended! We will be back.




