Inland Waterways Association - Northampton Branch

DEFRA, the government department responsible for our waterways, has slashed the budgets of British Waterways by around 7.5 million this year and they plan to impose more cuts which could total up to 60 million over the next five years.

With government investment, canals have improved substantially in recent years but there is now serious concern



that without the necessary funding for proper maintenance and investment, that they could revert back to the way they were - unpleasant and unsafe places to visit - not the sort of place to take the family for a pleasant walk. The cuts have also meant the announcement of 180 jobs losses at British Waterways.

The Inland Waterways Association and other user groups have been campaigning to get the cuts restored and last November there were protests all around the country highlighting the concerns of those who boat, walk, fish or those who live near a canal. To coincide with the presentation of petitions and letters of objection to government, a last-push protest event is being planned at Braunston.

We are calling on all boaters, anglers, ramblers, local residents and those who enjoy our waterways to join in on the 3rd March between 11-12am when the canal will be blockaded by boats between the Bottom Lock and Butcher's Bridge. Our local MP, Tim Boswell has agreed to join us!

Come along and help to make a fuss. Show government they won't get away with interfering with our waterways. Our canals and rivers are part of our national heritage.

Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

When we hear the word 'lent' the thing that might first come to mind is: "what am I going to give up for lent this year?"

School recollections of lent may be singing '40 days and 40 nights' and the re-telling of Jesus in the wilderness for 40 days- being tempted by the devil.

Commercially it is a time when shops want to skip the solemn, austere side of the season and jump ahead with chocolate bunnies and easter eggs.

But what is lent?

Lent is traditionally a time of preparation for Easter. Candidates who were going to be baptised at Easter would go through this time of penance. A period of preparation marked by prayer, and fasting. In Services in Church there is a simplicity about worship- no 'Alleluias' for instance!- and no flowers. A 'giving up' in the worship which is in stark contrast to the joy with which we greet the resurrection on Easter day.

The 40 days of lent can seem like a long time- particularly if you've given up chocolate! Just as Jesus went into the wilderness for 40 days stripped of all the luxuries of life and thrown upon the grace of God, we have the opportunity during lent of letting go of some unconstructive things which can clutter up our lives, and live life a little differently.

How can I best keep Lent?

Keeping in mind the traditional disciplines of Lent: prayer, fasting and giving to charity, you may want to think about some of the following:

- Could you attend one extra service during the weeks of Lent?
- Could you try using one of the Lenten devotions or study groups? (e.g our Lent group on a Wednesday night - see details in this BVN)
- Could you give up something and put the money saved in a charity box?
- Could you set aside some time each day/week for bible reading or silent prayer?
- Could you think about your life and explore with someone of prayer where your journey is leading you?

Lent is an amazing time- hard to describe. But if you can persevere with the lenten discipline things happen. There is time to be still and sometimes not have 'what I want' 'when I want' . There is time to realise my own human fragility. There is time to recollect what Jesus did for me in his life and on the cross. There is time to examine myself-and time to experience the closeness of God, His love and forgiveness. Like the Season in which it falls Lent is a Season of maturity and growth!

You may not be an active Church goer, though you may regard yourself as a Christian. Do take hold of the opportunities which lent offers- and draw close to God, as God draws close to you.





Braunston Walkers - Saturday 17 February 2007 - Three Rivers and a Tunnel (12.1 miles)

This walk takes in the sources of no less than three rivers all within a 3 mile radius of Badby. The Nene flows out to sea in the Wash, the Cherwell flows into the Thames and then out to sea at Southend and the Leam flows into the Avon then the Severn and finally out to sea in the Bristol Channel. Then there is the tunnel but more of that later... Nine of us drove to Badby and donning boots, set off through the lovely old village and up to the church where a small lane leads out and on towards Badby Woods. There was some mist but no rain as we followed the lane and entered the first of many muddy fields. After the recent snow and rain we expected some mud but each gateway was a trial as we entered the edge of the wood and steadily climbed up hill. At the top with the sun burning off the mist we were rewarded with beautiful views back over Badby and down into Fawsley Park. We were following the Knightley Way footpath over the hill and through a sweeping field down to the lakes at Fawsley. The Knightley Way was Northamptonshire's first County Path. Opened in 1972 it stretches from Badby to Greens Norton near Towcester passing through very attractive countryside formerly owned by the Knightley family of Fawsley Hall. We walked to the church at Fawsley but this was locked and so we then returned to the old gated road alongside the Horse Pond lake and the old hall itself. There are some superb

old stone houses along this road with fabulous views over the open parkland. After the last of the houses and boiled sweets supplied by Terry, we turned left and followed a farm track downhill to Fawsley Farm where there are several converted barns supplying upmarket tourist accommodation. These are in a very peaceful spot, well away from any main roads. Our path rose up over fields and then crossing a small road between Charwelton and Preston Capes it continued over fields to the old church at Church Charwelton. It is about a mile outside the village itself and situated next to the site of the medieval village it once served now clearly seen as the humps in the field.

Passing some curious cattle we crossed a disused railway and took a small path on the right leading into the village over the river Cherwell on the old packhorse bridge and more importantly into the pub.

The Fox and Hounds at Charwelton made us very comfortable and supplied excellent food at reasonable prices with prompt service. What more could you want. After a great break in the pub we tore ourselves away to continue over the A361 and along a lane.

The footpath, the Jurassic Way (Stamford to Banbury 88 miles), continued to a road where our path set off over ploughed, muddy fields but before that we decided to walk along the site of the old railway for about a mile to see the Catesby Tunnel. Now disused its massive entrance has a stone showing that it was finished in 1897. We searched in vain for a way back to our original path but had to retrace our

steps back to the road and then get back on track over ploughed and increasingly muddy fields. As the path rises past Steppington Farm and on towards Hellidon we could see over to our right the source of the River Cherwell at Cherwell Farm.

At the top of the hill with the windmill we were looking down at the peaceful village of Hellidon and the Leam Pool the small lake that is the source of the River Leam. We walked through the little village where one house had two magnificent peacocks in the garden and out on a gated road leading to Catesby. The views across to Shuckborough from here are fantastic. At Lower Catesby we turned right along the tree lined avenue towards Catesby House and then through the extensive gardens to view the other end of the tunnel. Then to Upper Catesby village and on towards Arbury Hill. The source of the River Nene. We branched off right past Haycock Farm and the intriguingly named Koenigsee Farm.

I am not sure why this should be named after a lake in Bavaria although the fields were extremely wet and muddy. We finally arrived back at Badby and the cars for the drive home. This is a magnificent walk taking in one of the most beautiful areas in our county. Why not come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. They are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful Northamptonshire scenery please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384. 




