#### Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

One of the joys of being in ministry is seeing members of the church 'grow into and display' the gifts that God has given them. Last year Marian Thomas was licensed as Reader to Braunston and the Daventry Team. This year some of us went down to support and share in Michelle Cotton's licensing as Parish Evangelist. There were over 200 licensed lay ministers in Peterborough Cathedral - all in good heart; all who could tell their own unique story of how God had led them to this moment. In our Churches we are also really blessed with Churchwardens and members of the Church

family who are gifted in so many different ways. Some have a pastoral heart, some have such a love for God they want to share, some are teachers, some are wonderful administrators - all are equally important. Michelle writes about what the day of her licensing meant to her:

"Peterborough Cathedral has always been my favourite Cathedral - I can remember at a young age singing in the Cathedral and feeling quite scared & in awe of my surroundings.

To be licensed in Peterborough Cathedral was very special to me! Two years of study has flown by - I've met some wonderful people and made friends for life! The Peterborough Diocese has a wonderful support network & it's on-going!

Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> May, what a brilliant and emotional day! I arrived at the Cathedral for a 10.30am service – the speaker for the service was Professor David Ford. (He was brilliant & so down to earth – I actually understood him)!

The Parish Evangelist's & Pastoral Assistants had lunch at St Mary's – after lunch Bishop Frank spoke to us all.

All the newly licensed people were escorted to the Cathedral earlier and by 1.45pm we were lined up in the procession ready for the service! (At this point I was really nervous)

The procession was wonderful – you had to see it to believe it! Over 200 people were being relicensed and 22 people were newly admitted!

Believe it or not God is really working in everybody's life! You may not be aware – but God really loves every one of us and he is moving in this place!

Seeing my friends & family at the Cathedral made me tearful – the music / hymns were brilliant!

But the special part of the service was making the

promises – in front of my family & friends!

It's now Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May and I'm still buzzing from Saturday!

Thank you again to everyone who came and supported me at Peterborough Cathedral. A huge Thank you to Rev Claire & All Saints' Church Braunston – who invested money, time, love and encouragement in me!"

When in the news we hear of declining numbers in the church it's important not to be too down hearted. Faith is still very much alive. Saturday 12th bore testimony that. to challenge is for today's Church to release the talents of her people- so that lives can be touched by the grace of God. For afterall, the Church is the people. Not people who are any superior to anyone else but who simply; 'know their need of God'.

I'm writing this early (the BVN editor will probably fall off his chair to receive this 'on time!') as 14 of us are off to the Holy Land tomorrow for 9 days. We will be praying for you out there as well as engaging with the tensions of a Holy Land divided. There will be lots to report back on-on return! #### **Parish Council News**

#### Daventry/Braunston footpath link

The District Council, supported by the Parish Council, has recently submitted a project to the Sustrans Connect2 Scheme, to open up the old railway line between Daventry and Braunston, as a footpath and Cycleway. Our grateful thanks to all of you who helped, by clicking on and voting for the scheme.

Were accepted onto the "Long List" but unfortunately we did not make it to the final list, which was submitted to the Big Lottery Fund. However there is a possibility thatthe scheme could still go ahead as we are now on the reserve list. Sustrans has until the end of May to prepare a final submission for further assessment. They recently wrote:

"We will aim to do all we can to support you in the development of your scheme, including searching for additional ffunding if we have the opportunity. We will also include you in aany correspondence with the Big Lottery Fund and matters relating to the public vote - in fact everything we can."

In the meantime officers at the District Council are continuing to prepare the scheme, in the hope that either we are re assessed or other means of funding can be found.

#### Neighbourhood Watch.

Thank you to those villagers who have expressed an interest in joining a newly formed neighbourhood watch scheme. The recent spate of burglaries in the village has highlighted the need for representatives in all areas. We would all feel happier when we leave for work or go on holiday, to know that a village network is there, in the background, to keep an eye on things for us. Bogus callers who cruelly prey on our elderly pensioners need to be identified, just the noting of a suspicious caller or vehicle



and passing on the information to a local co-ordiantor could make all the difference.

A recent presentation at the Parish Meeting stressed that the scheme requires very little time or effort on the part of individuals. It does not mean a commitment to endless meetings and form filling. The more people join, the easier and more efficient the scheme will be.

It is a proven fact that areas with good neighbourhood watch schemes become no-go areas for criminals, it is too risky for them and they go eklsewhere. There could be an addedd bonus too of lower insurance premiums for householders, if we can become a "no crime" area.





As soon as SMP, the suppliers finally start to plan the installation, after much chasing, it starts to rain again!!



## All Saints Church Braunston Remedial works to loose or dangerous Grave Headstones

The Churchwardens at All Saints Church, Braunston have initiated an inspection of the Churchyard and the Cemetery to establish the safety and security of the public using these areas.

As a result of this investigation a number of grave headstones were noted to be either loose, insecurely fixed or dangerous to the public using the Churchyard and the Cemetery.

The headstones identified are listed below. Relatives of those burried in the particular plots are asked to carry out remedial works before 31st August 2007 to ensure the headstones are securelyfixed and do not pose any danger to the public.

In the absence of any appropriate action by relatives the PCC have authorised action be taken to remove the risks identified and any costs so incurred may be re-charged.

For this walk we drove about 11/2 hours up to the White Peak area of the, in my opinion at least, underrated, Peak District National Park. With half the population of the country living within 60 miles of its centre and something like 22 million visitors each year, it is only beaten for visitor numbers by one other national park in the world that of Mount Fuji in Japan but that is a bit too far for our group to travel. So twelve of us met up at the car park at Dovedale after driving up through the old market town of Ashbourne and then down into this spectacular and beautiful valley. The weather in May had so far this year been very wet, the April showers coming a month late, and although that may be great for the gardeners it is not so good for ramblers. Being a hardy bunch we expected the worst and set out fully prepared for a good soaking. The sun shone down on us as we entered the gorge by the burbling River Dove between the hills of Thorpe Cloud and Bunster. Crossing the river by bridge we walked along the river bank up to the old stepping stones. Dovedale is a fabulous place much walked but you do not have to go far along the river to lose the crowds. As we walked Jane pointed out some of interesting flora of the area including crosswort, so named because of the small bunches of yellow flowers each one in the shape of a tiny cross and also stitchwort, yellow archangel, campion, herb robert, speedwell and bugle. The banks were also lined with strong smelling wild garlic. The path started to ascend up to the high point of Lovers Leap and on the opposite bank the steep pinnacles of rock known as the twelve apostles. We twelve non apostles continued along the stone path each stone carrying an amazing array of fossils some looking like razor shellfish. Further along we passed the rocks of Tissington spires and then the fantastic natural arch covering the mysterious Reynard's cave, This bit of the walk was deeply wooded and the sun shone through the trees as we followed the deep river past a man fishing for trout in waters made famous by Izaak Walton.

We walked through a meadow leading down to the tiny village of Milldale and crossing the river at the Viator's bridge. In the book "The Compleat Angler" written in 1653. Izaak Walton describes a frightening descent of the steep hill down into Milldale that is made by his character Viator. Upon reaching the little narrow bridge he is quoted as saying "What's here, the sign of a bridge? Do you travel in wheelbarrows in this country? This bridge was made for nothing else - why a mouse can hardly go over it, 'tis not two fingers broad!" It has been known as Viator's bridge or wheelbarrow bridge ever since.

Unfortunately we had to cross the bridge and then walk up the same steep hill!

It was at Milldale, as we paused to rest, that we first met the Dolphin Morris Dancers of Nottingham. Playing accordions and dressed in full regalia, they danced to entertain us.

Several of our hardy bunch joined in, although I noticed none of the men did!

There was no delaying any longer we had to face the steep climb from Milldale up to Alstonefield along the narrow Millway Lane. The lunch time pub was in Alstonefield so it was vital that we tackled the hill.

Arriving at the top puffing and panting we had reached the pub, The George at Alstonefield, we ordered excellent beer, wonderful thick home backed ham sandwiches and relaxed outside in the sunshine to enjoy our well earned lunch. This is a fantastic pub and a poem on the wall summed it up as follows:

"I must go down to the George again, to the best inn under the sky,

And all I ask is a ploughman's lunch and a glass of ale nearby,

For the homely bar, the friendly staff and the bright fire burning,

With the smiling sun on the village green, set my heart a yearning"

The peace was shattered as the Morris Dancers turned up. Were they following us? We watched as they performed what their bowler hatted leader called a "futility dance" Suddenly we felt a few spots of rain (Phillip said perhaps they were doing a rain dance) but it was not enough to turn sandwiches soggy and never lasted so soon we were again basking in the sunshine.

Sadly tearing ourselves away we had a walk to do. We skipped out of the village in time with the music of the Morris men and promptly joined the wrong road but thanks to Carol we soon turned around and sending Angie out on point duty, we followed on the non recced path to Wetton. Wonderful views back over to Dovedale and on to our next destination, the Manifold valley.

Just before Wetton where incidentally they hold the world toe wrestling championships (honest!) we turned left down the Ashbourne Lane on our way back. The path soon turns right over

toward the imposing stately manor of Castern Hall standing on the side of the fell with its great views over the Manifold River. Before we descended we were greeted by a flypast of a Spitfire resplendent in its invasion colours. A fantastic sight and sound over this superb scenery. It was the extremely difficult to arrange this fly by but much appreciated. After another steep ascent and we were walking downhill to enjoy an ice cream at the in the middle of Ilam before crossing fields back to the car park and home. This was a superb walk through some really spectacular scenery, totally different from home, but fantastic nevertheless.




## THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION BRAUNSTON & DISTRICT




