Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

There is a bit of a cloud over the Daventry Team at the moment as we bid farewell on 18th November to our Team Rector Revd Owen Page. The Team Service at 9.30am at Holy Cross is one to which you are all warmly invited.

Owen has been 'Team Rector' for nine years and the seven Churches which make up the Team; 'Ashby, Braunston, Catesby, Daventry, Hellidon, Staverton, and Welton' have worked well together and visioned well together under his leadership. For those who know Revd Owen he will be remembered for his 'wicked sense of humour'. His sermons which often start with a joke but hold a meaningful 'punch'. His honest and robust way of handling difficult situations. His pastoral heart. He has been a safe pair of hands for the Team and we will greatly miss him.

But, (quoting a line from the Sound of Music, which I had the privilege of going to see recently!)—when God closes a door, He opens a window. Times of change are often growing times—and we as a Team of Churches—have the duty and joy of continuing to pray and work together, confident of God's continual guidance.

I know often we can't live up to this, and often we fail - but to be willing to be a worker for God is both humbling and exciting!

ION AGAINST METAL THEFTS - RATION PILFER

rthamptonshire Police is calling on the public to be zir eyes and ears as they step up their operation to prevent metal thefts across the county.



ings in Daventry and surrounding areas are all being sted by people cashing in on a crime trend brought about in recent months by scrap metals increasing in value several times over.

ne owners of premises install a range of additional crime prevention measures nd systems, the police say members of the public who live around or near erable buildings such as churches and schools, should keep a special lookout for suspicious activity and report it immediately.

example, this could involve checking adjacent buildings if you get up in the it, or as you walk your dog, or drive past, or noting and reporting suspicious es which might be used as thieves survey potential targets, or in the course of crime.

le are urged to ring Northamptonshire Police on 08453 700700, quoting the name Operation Pilfer, or dial 999 of they spot a crime in progress.

al priority is being given to responding to calls about metal thefts. Arrests are le on a frequent basis and an officer from the Force's Homicide and Major rime Team, DCI John Jones, has been designated to manage the policing operation.

ones says that information from vigilant members of the public is vital if the police are to successfully target those responsible for metal thefts.

These crimes are damaging our society and seriously affecting people's noods. We want people to be alert to any suspicious activity and not hesitate to report it. We will do our best to respond", he added.

police are also focusing actively on scrapyards where metal can be disposed by working with local authorities, churches, English Heritage and Local MPs to raise awareness of the problems.

Support for our Armed Forces

Villagers of and visitors to Braunston continue to show their support of the Armoured Support Company of the Royal Marines serving in South Helmand Province of Afghanistan.

An incredible 72 parcels have now been sent out to the A.S.C. and once again my sincere thanks go to you and to Carolyn and Cay at the Post Office. In their spare time they pack, weigh and dispatch each parcel. Thanks also go to Angela and Wayne at the shop for allowing the box to be displayed at the counter and also for providing the wrapping paper for each parcel. Carolyn and Cay make an excellent job of wrapping each parcel so, I wonder how many rolls of brown paper have been used!!

News from the "front" has been sparse of late but I have reason to believe that the A.S.C. is in theatre. In his last letter the Commanding Officer finished off by saying that he had to prepare his kit for an operation starting the following day. He also said that our parcels go with the A.S.C. on their operations. Apparently he finds them a good way of knowing that his men are safe as he can distribute the contents during their rendezvous.

Once again my sincere thanks to everyone for their continued support. It is indeed good to know that our contributions go a long way in reminding the service personnel that they are thought of and supported by the people back here in Braunston.

Like me, I am sure that you wish all our armed forces both in Afghanistan and Iraq a safe and successful deployment.

Jetty Field.

Many thanks for the eight volunteers who finished clearing the undergrowth in the Garden Area which most visitors can see but also trimmed back the hedge at the bottom of the Wildlife Area. This had grown considerably since it was laid and is now hedge shaped again.

In June we heard news that our entry into the Breathing Spaces award had been successful. This was compiled and researched by Kay from Eastfields and will provide over £4000 for the last of the first stages of the management Plan in setting up Jetty Field for the future. Most of the jobs have been identified and details are available from myself to anyone who would wish to offer estimates for the work to be completed over the winter. The majority of the tasks involve hedge and fence work, footpath creation, provision of water supply and the design and execution of an information board and linked leaflets.

Maintenance continues non-stop with the next work day on Saturday November 10th from 9am until noon. There will be a bonfire on this day - we hope that it will look just like a Guy Fawkes fire. Lots of cutting back, pruning and some stone spreading to extend the path. This just gives enough time to get home for lunch before the Village Hall Autumn Fair. Its all go, isn't it!

Braunston Walkers - Saturday 20/10/2007 Two Reservoirs and a Pond

The weather was superb, bright sunshine and an autumnal chill in the air, as we met up to drive to the village of Creaton to start this walk. There were 11 of us raring to go as we left the cars and walked uphill across the main A5199 to join The Macmillan Way footpath out of Creaton. The scenery here is splendid and with the trees putting on a fantastic autumn display we walked downhill past grazing horses and then steadily uphill to a small road between Guilsborough and Teeton. Turning right along this lane we skirted Teeton and turned right towards Holdenby.

This is a beautiful area with rolling farmland. At the sharp left hand bend at North Lodge Cottages we left the road pausing to eat Terry's welcome Foxes Dark Glacier Mints and joined the footpath through fields with inquisitive horses, over several unusual stiles, on towards Holdenby House. This is still the Macmillan Way which we had walked on previously around Chipping Warden. It is a long distance footpath opened in 1996, developed to raise money for the Macmillan cancer relief charity and now stretching from Boston in Lincolnshire all the way to Barnstable in North Devon, 450 miles across England! The stretch between Abbotbury in Dorset and Barnstable was added in 2001. We decided against doing it all as we wanted lunch and soon turned right on a small road which leads to East Haddon. Pausing long enough to enter the magnificent

grounds of Holdenby House, closed to the public but we were with Alan so that's all right. We walked along the entrance road to see the fabulous house. Apparently this immense house was actually only a gate house, the original palace had been demolished. It was built by Elizabeth the first's book keeper who must have been extremely well paid or was skimming a little for himself! Leaving the grounds with rottweillers biting at our ankles we walked along the road and took a footpath on the right over open fields towards Ravensthorpe and lunch.

Crossing a footbridge over a small brook we entered a green track and walked up hill, past a lovely pond and on towards the village. The previous week when doing the recce had been misty or even, dare I say it, foggy. We thought that anyone only doing the first half of this walk would miss out on seeing the reservoirs. Today however with the sun glaring down and blue sky completely unbroken, we looked down to the right and there was the wonderful sight of Ravensthorpe Reservoir. We quickened our pace to the village and arrived at the welcoming sight of The Chequers pub where we were soon ensconced with excellent food and beer. This is yet another great pub and the food, beer, welcome and service was first rate. Highly recommended.

After lunch we set off, reluctantly, down to the causeway road, past Cuffey's Field

with its great display of dahlias to cross the reservoir. This is an ornithologists dream with lots of birds, ducks and waders to spot. We saw amongst others the bronze coloured, Ruddy duck (there must be joke there but I must get on) black cormorants, huge herons looking like pterodactyls and all manner of other bird life. A magnificent sight. We spotted a new crop of elephant grass in the fields around the lake. We believe it is used for bio fuel but it certainly looks out of place in an English country setting and looks more like Vietnam.


We turned right after the reservoir and started the steady uphill climb towards Hollowell and at the cross roads we joined a field path to the top of the hill which lays between our two reservoirs, Ravensthorpe behind us and Hollowell in the valley ahead. Rejoining the road we walked through the village and started the ascent of the final, long hill up to

Creaton and back to the cars parked by the old village green and home to be disappointed by the Rugby World Cup final.


