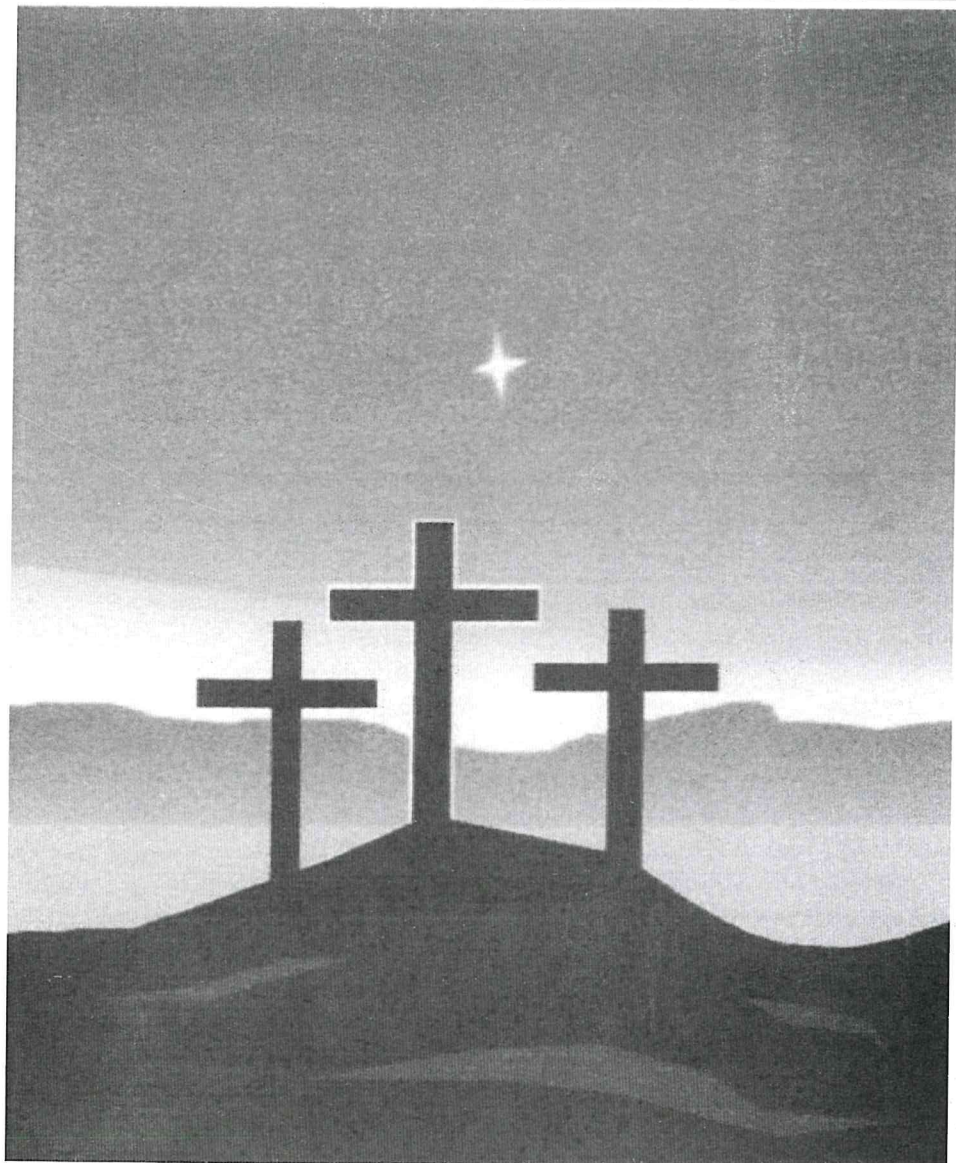

Vicar's Letter

Dear friends...

As we receive this magazine we will be drawing very close to Holy week.

I wonder what Lent has been like for you? Has it been any different to the norm? For some of us it may have been a time of being without our favourite food, or a time of study, prayer and reflection. I can think of quite a few parishioners for whom Lent has been a painful time- a time of watching and waiting because something has happened to a close loved one, or there has been the anxiety of waiting to hear from the doctor, or life has been tough and God has seemed distant.

A dormant time when not much seems to be happening- rather like the tomb in which Jesus was laid to rest after his crucifixion- damp and dark and dormant.

Revd Liz was telling me on the phone yesterday how the theme for Staverton

school at the moment is *truth*. She was talking with the children about how do we know what we hear in the media is true? At this time when all the parties are trying to win our votes and are parading their policies- how do we know what they are saying is true? And one child answered we don't know for sure- we have to *trust*.

For some trusting comes more naturally than others. John looked in the empty tomb, saw the discarded bed clothes and believed. Thomas found it more difficult and asked to put his hand in Jesus' wounds to believe.

Evidence for the resurrection is patchy- Josephus the scholar of the time talks about Jesus in his records. Pilate did all he could to make sure the tomb was ring-fenced by soldiers so that the disciples could not steal Jesus' body away and make claims he is alive later. Others have said Jesus fainted on the

cross and didn't really die and then he recovered in the grave! Then we have the written records of the four Gospel writers. Their accounts are similar but have some differences. How do we know what is the truth?

Taking a rather trivial example of trust- When I buy a new chair I sit down and hope/trust it will bear my whole weight and not collapse about my ears! I could look at it for hours and say 'will I, won't I?' but it's only when I go for it and give into gravity that I know whether the chair will take my weight! I sit believing that all will be ok- and it's only through having sat that I will know whether my faith was well founded.

Was the tomb empty because Jesus was raised from the dead? Well I won't know until I trust him with my day today. Telling him my fears, sharing with him my joys, asking him for help in my decisions, handing over to him the people I'm concerned for and waiting on him for direction- through people, through words, through the stillness of his presence.

We have a banner at All Saints made at another Easter workshop- it says 'Jesus is alive'. If I were a liturgical purist I should take it down in Lent- and wait for the joyful Easter morning. As it is I will take it down on Good Friday . There are, for all of us, moments when our trust is tested- and that was very much the case for those who watched and waited at the foot of the cross. But if we wait with him through Holy week, through our own personal Gethsemane

we will not be disappointed- he will come to us and make his home with us. As a fairly new worship song by Brian Bell describes...

Christ is alive! Let Christians sing.
The Cross stands empty to the sky
Let streets and homes with praises ring.
Love, drowned in death, shall never die...

Christ is alive! No longer bound
To distant years in Palestine,
But saving, healing here and now,
And touching every place and time.

This month we have had the blessing of Reverend Chrys Tremththanmor coming to join us in the Daventry Team and we look forward to her ministry to the Parish of Welton, the Team and to young people. We trust that God is with us in all our joys and challenges great and small. Concerning our challenges we are invited to trust that he will work through them with us. Whether it be the Parish share, a leaking roof, a challenging person to get on with, poor health or an uncertain future: 'Behold I am with you always,' promises Jesus.

'Amen to that' we all say! 'Alleluia, what a Saviour!'

God bless you this Easter – do come and join us for the services in Holy week so that the joy of Easter will be even more of a cause for celebration!

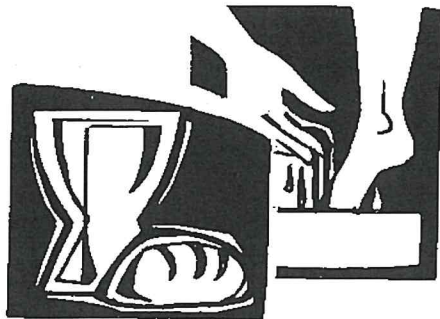

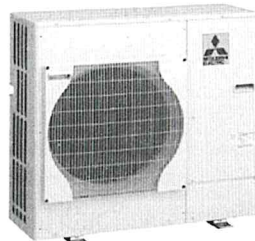

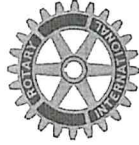

Walk Saturday 20th March 2010 Hellidon and Catesby (c.10 miles)

Hellidon is situated in a small valley and the Leam pool, just behind the old pub, is the source of the River Leam which flows its way westward into the Severn and then the Bristol Channel. It is a delightful village and an ideal start point for a super walk. Eleven of us met up at the village hall and drove over to Hellidon with a fine drizzle spoiling the magnificent views. Fortunately as soon as we started our walk the rain stopped and we were able to enjoy the surroundings on an early spring day. We walked downhill from the pub and past the old well and then took a field path on the right that follows the infant River Leam and then crosses the river along a lovely old valley and through mediaeval fish ponds to Lower Catesby. Catesby House with its fantastic lakes is over to our right as we turn left onto a small road and then right before joining a tree lined avenue which, at one time must have been the avenue leading up to the big house. Sheep scattered as we strolled along the path. At the end we turned right along the lane and then branched right onto the Jurassic Way, footpath over two or three fields full of sheep to reach the magnificent old Catesby Viaduct which straddles the valley over the River Leam.

Sadly this is now falling apart but in its day it must have been a wonderful sight with steam trains chugging along its length and passengers enjoying the amazing views. From the top of the viaduct we could see Braunston in the distance and then panning left Shuckborough Hall and the parkland and then over past Hellidon Lakes golf course and Catesby. This is a great spot and since the viaduct is rapidly falling apart you should really try to visit it now before it disappears for good. The top has now been fenced off as too dangerous so

we walked under it which is probably even more dangerous but we all made it! We retraced our steps over the fields and back to Catesby and then took another path off to the right just before the hamlet, over the hill and dropped down to another brook which we followed over several fields.

On the previous Monday we had recced this walk and the weather had been magnificent but today it was cloudy and although not pouring with rain it had been wet enough to make it mucky underfoot. We had seen a herd of 30 to 40 deer running over the fields in the recce and suddenly there they were again, in the corner of a field, eyeing us warily as we passed them. A fantastic sight and a real bonus. Our path turned left and then crossed a lane which leads back to Hellidon and then left onto fields of crops that were extremely tacky underfoot and left us looking like deep sea divers with heavy boots full of mud. This was very tiring and we were delighted to see the first houses of Priors Marston, our lunch stop, appearing out of the gloom. We passed Priors Farm on our left and continued into the village and through the old church yard To The Holly Bush pub.

This is a magnificent old pub which has changed hands recently. We were soon ensconced over pints of London Pride ale and huge sandwiches and of course, crispy and delicious chips. Fires roared in the hearth as we sat and relaxed after a gruelling muddy walk. After giving the pub the Highly Recommended by Braunston Walkers, endorsement, we donned muddy boots and set off again back through the churchyard past the grave of Caroline Bradley, the show jumper, and back out of the village past Priors Farm and then we branched right and

onto a fabulous footpath which cuts right across the Hellidon Lakes golf course. We emerged without being hit by flying balls and climbed very steeply up to Hellidon. The views from here are normally superb but by now the rain had started again and the views were wreathed in cloud. We turned right along the road then left before taking the footpath on our right over two more muddy crop fields to reach the Byfield to Priors Marston. In the recce with fine weather we had walked up to the Hellidon Tower but today with the weather going downhill fast we decided to save that for a better day and turned left and left again back to the cars in Hellidon and home for a welcome cuppa!! This is a great walk with fantastic sweeping views if the weather is right!
