

Letter from Sue Rigsby - Headteacher, Braunstson Primary School

Revd Claire has asked me to write for the Braunston Village News for the month of May whilst she is away on her sabbatical. I was very pleased to be asked and then wondered what on earth I could write about that would be of interest. I have decided to share my thoughts about working in Braunston and what it means to me to be the headteacher of the village school here.

I had been head of Lumbertubs Primary School, part of the Eastern District of Northampton, for 4 ½ years when I saw the advertisement for the headship of Braunston. I wanted to come back to this side of the county, having always lived and worked in Daventry prior to going to Lumbertubs. When I came to look around the school, everyone I met was so friendly and helpful and the ethos of the school was so warm and welcoming, I knew this was where I wanted to

be. Needless to say I was absolutely ecstatic to be offered the role after an intensive day of interviewing.

Well now I am here and my feelings have not changed at all. The staff, the children, the parents, the governors and those members of the village I have met, have all made me feel very at home. I love the fact that there is a real community feel about working in Braunston. This was really brought home to me at Christmas with the collection of shoeboxes for Liberia. Every time I looked out of my office window I saw yet another member of the village bringing their shoebox donations. I also very much enjoyed the fact that many members of the community came to the school concert and also to Songs around the Christmas Tree. I had not experienced this level of community involvement at Lumbertubs and I feel very

strongly that the school should be at the centre of its locality.

The church gives Braunston School the support it needs as a very caring place to be, the visits to All Saints Church are very important to the children and staff of the school. The atmosphere and wonder created when we lit the candles at Christingle was wonderful, a very positive experience for all of us in the church at the time. The Easter service, in which we have just been involved, made this time of year even more meaningful to us all (and the children enjoyed the eggs on offer too!). Our next visit to church is for Pentecost and there will be a Pentecost Picnic afterwards for the children at the village playing field (weather permitting). Please come and join us at either venue, you will be very welcome.

I will end by saying once again how pleased I am to be in the village and to part of such a lovely school and I would like to share our school prayer with you:

This is our school, let peace live here. Let the rooms be full of happiness. Let us love everyone here,

And never hurt anyone by what we say or what we do.

Because at Braunston School WE CARE.







Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 17th April 2010 Fawsley and Hellidon (c.12 miles)

Rockies and the Himalayas well in this walk we visit a lesser known range of hills, no less spectacular, in Northamptonshire and the highest points in our county. After driving over to Fawsley and parking by the old church ten intrepid souls set off on a perfect spring day, blazing sunshine with a bright blue clear sky and not even the sound of any jet aircraft due to the Icelandic volcano. In high spirits we walked along the road past the imposing Fawsley Hall and on past beautiful stone houses through the parkland of Fawsley During this classic walk we would take in some wonderful scenery and hills and another bit of the old, disused, Grand Central Railway but without Julia Bradbury. (more's the pity I say!) We turned right, off the road, along a farm track past Fawsley Farm now known as The Granary behind which is a wooded valley shown on the map as The Dingle. Our path lead us on over fields of sheep with lambs bleating and uphill to cross a minor road and approach the hamlet of Church Charwelton and the humps in the ground that are the site of the medieval village of Charwelton. This lies about a mile east of the village of Charwelton and it is a beautiful spot. The path continued over a field finally reaching a bridge over the old railway which we would see more of after lunch. After the crossing the railway we took a

After the crossing the railway we took a footpath over a stile on right and then a field path running parallel with the old railway back towards Charwelton itself. We passed the old pond called Holywell Pool and by now it was more like mid summer than April and it was getting hotter as sweaters were removed. We paused for Terry's boiled sweets and then, suitably refreshed, walked over two

fields prior to turning left along what looked to be an old track over two more ridge and furrow fields to emerge at the farm track between Chrwelton Hill Farm on the side of the hill on the far side of the A361 and Charwelton Lodge farm hidden behind another hill on our left. Following this track in a north westerly direction we reached the busy A361, crossed it and then cut across a field to join a footpath that leads steeply uphill past two old farmsteads in wonderful settings on the hillside and up to the Hellidon Radio tower. Huffing and puffing we made it to the top at 222 metres above sea level. The views from here are stunning. We were looking over Windmill Hill at Hellidon, then north, to Braunston All Saints church steeple and then panning right over Staverton, Arbury Hill at 225 metres and its little sister Sharman's Hill at 224 metres, then Fawsley and the Preston Capes. Due South we could see the General Foods factory in Banbury pumping out smoke and over Priors Hardwick to the Warwickshire plain. We enjoyed the spectacular views but with stomachs rumbling we soon set off from just behind the huge concrete tower (according to some of our team this is leaning, just like the one in Pisa and that is before imbibing at lunch!) to drop down the fields towards Hellidon and the Red Lion pub. Our path emerged onto a farm track then right along a road towards Byfield before taking a left turn and down into Hellidon. The heat of the sun meant that we were more than ready for our lunch time beer. The pub had saved us a table and we were soon enjoying foaming pints of Old Hookey together with super bacon baguettes and chips. The food and welcome

was excellent and, of course, highly recommended. The pub, run by Bruce who used to have the Admiral Nelson, nestles in a beautiful valley and has an enviable position well worth a visit.

After lunch we walked down through the old stone village and took a footpath off to the right that skirts a pond which is one of a series of ponds where the River Leam rises. Our path was soon climbing up a small valley and then crossing a road we turned right and left onto a footpath which eventually follows the old disused Grand Central Railway and the embankment that covers the Catesby tunnel with its old airshafts studded along the bank. We soon arrived at the entrance of the tunnel which was completed in 1897. It is a huge entrance and through the gloom we could make out the exit just under 2 miles away. This must have been a real feat of engineering in its day. So still with no sign of Julia Bradbury, we continued to join a road where we turned left and arrived back at the A361. We crossed the

busy road and struck off diagonally over fields to reach the lane just above The Granary and then followed the road back to the cars at Fawsley and home for a welcome cuppa!!

Do come and join us on our regular monthly walks on the third Saturday in the month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy a, not too strenuous, walk.

A great way to have some exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful scenery. Please call either Philip 01788891437 or Ray 01788891384. We normally meet at 10 o' clock at the village hall.


