Letter from Marian Thomas - Licensed Lay Minister

Dear Friends, I cannot believe that it is now a year since I fell into the canal at the Stop House and turned the experience into a short talk on trust in God at the Marina service demonstrated with the use of a skate board and a plank courtesy of President. This year Rev. Claire has left it to me to organise the Service, and I feel that God is asking me to talk about the wonderful Joy that He brings us if we have faith in Him. There are many well known instances of this joy with which we are all familiar, although at first it may not occur to us.

The first one is at Christmas when we remember the birth of Jesus. How the angel appeared to the shepherds on the hills above Bethlehem saying "fear not, I bring you glad tidings of great Joy, to you is born this day in the city of David achild" Doesn't this fill you with joy? Every time we hear of a child being born it is like a new miracle and we cry with happiness. I find also that when a child is brought to church for baptism and we welcome that child into the family of God I get all lumpy and have to swallow hard to stop me mak-

ing a fool of myself, just a big soft>' really, that's me. I am sure that also it is for you at family times, of weddings, and other celebrations.

But I want to look at times when perhaps we do not associate happenings as times of joy. In hospitals when someone manages to walk for the first time after being severely injured, or when someone who has cancer has a period of remission or even perhaps when someone manages to talk about a problem for the first time and finds themselves released from a trap of silence. I am continually aware that God is with me through all the bad times as well as the good and this brings me great joy, I know that He feels with me when I am sad just as He rejoices with me when I am happy, and this is very comforting.

How do I know this? You may think that I am talking off the top of my head, but I am not truly.

After Jesus was crucified, he was restored to life as God had promised, and all his followers turned from deep sorrow to ecstatic joy, this Jesus who one minute they were mourning was


alive and talking with them, telling them not to be afraid that He would be with them always to the end of time. Another thing he said was that in God's house there is room for everyone, that death is not the end, and to me this seems as if it is just another beginning, what joy it must be to be with Him in heaven. So I almost look forward to dying, a time to anticipate joyfully, to learn more about our creator. Meanwhile I watch God's creation from our narrowboat and wonder at its beauty. The skylark is twittering above the fields near Willoughby, the ducklings are fussing about in the canal watched over by their anxious mother, and the lambs jump for joy randomly as they enjoy the warmth of the sun and life in general. The leaves in

the hedges are bright green now and the flowers on the thorn bushes are opening. There is so much about which we can rejoice. So come to the Marina service at 9.30 on 27th June, (and it is a question of cramming in as many people as we can,) do feel free to come and join us, we will be singing lots of favourite hymns and songs and it is a really joyful occasion. So many people hear what we have to say and sing about as they stand on the bridge, and listen from the boats, and they have a chance to see the joy which we have and to share in it.

I pray that you will experience the peace and joy of God in the month ahead and always

There will be no meetings in July & August but the first meeting of the autumn and winter programme will be on Tuesday 20th September.







Daventry Team Sponsored Walk Rogation Sunday 9/5/2010 (14 miles)

Rogation days are four days in the church calendar traditionally set apart for solemn processions to invoke God's mercy. 
Many thanks to all the organisers, the enthusiastic bellringers, all those that sponsored us and especially those that supplied such wonderful food and drink to us weary travellers.


