Braunston Walkers Saturday 21/11/2009 Draycote Water... and a bit More (c.10 miles)

Crocodiles, Chickens and an Aeronautical Coincidence

Many of us have walked around Draycote Water, either sponsored for charities or just for exercise, and admired the views over the lake but we had something different planned as we met up at the village hall. Despite the grey damp conditions ten of us turned out for the walk, drove to Grandborough to start the walk. We started out of the village on the Leamington Hastings road for a quarter or mile or so before turning right at a footpath sign passing an old hav filled barn. Although there was a bit of fine rain now and again the weather was great for a walk. Our path lead us along hedgerows and steadily up to the summit of Beck Hill. This hill is, at 85 metres, actually just a small bump in an otherwise flat area although from it's peak you could just see the top of Braunston church spire in the distance behind Grandborough. Just past the summit is a new coarse fishing area with a large wooden hut and some newly landscaped lakes. It looks good now and will improve once the vegetation around grows up. We dropped down hill to reach the River Leam meandering along the valley.

The path clings to the river and eventually reaches a bridge which we had to cross. The designer of this old metal bridge must have wondered long and hard how he could build it to make it as awkward as possible for ramblers to climb over! After much cursing and puffing we managed to traverse the bridge and followed the field path with Foxley Farm over to our left and a

pheasant shooting woodland to our right. We had to duck here in the recce as a shoot was taking place even though the beaters assured us that we were perfectly safe on the footpath. Fortunately there was no shooting as we continued over fields to reach the busy A426. We braved the speeding cars, crossed the road and climbed a stile to reach the safety of fields near Toft Cottage Farm. Ahead of us was the dam that holds the water of Draycote and we continued over the field to reach a stile in front of which was a swamp of oozing mud and whatever else. We followed each others, ever deeper footprints to safely reach the stile with no major mishaps. We then walked though trees up to a gate taking us through to the edge of the dam which we had to climb. Emerging at the top we had fabulous views over the lake. Pausing here we spent time looking at the ducks, geese and cormorants and then continued right along the dam and then left along a wooden walkway which cuts a corner and takes you through a wooded area at the top corner of the reservoir. We emerged on the road that goes all the way around the lake and after passing the Alpaccas at Toft House we left the path on the right and walked uphill into Thurlaston on a hill above the lake. There is no through road at Thurlaston and consequently it does not suffer from passing traffic but they had to put up with us as we turned left at the road and then took a footpath right where there is a tree planted in 1981 to commemorate the royal wedding.

Along this lovely old footpath we passed a small pond in a private garden with a sign

that said "BEWARE CROCODILES, TREASSPASSERS WILL BE EATEN" Avoiding this fate we emerged by Biggin Hall, crossed the road and took a field path through a farm yard.

Back in September 2005 our group had walked around Draycote and were treated to a flypast by the Battle of Britain flight, a Lancaster, Spitfire and Hurricane. By an amazing coincidence here we were four years later being buzzed by two vintage American fighters, probably Mustangs or Tomahawks. This was extremely difficult to arrange but was a great sight.

After a muddy ploughed field the path took us through the golf course where we narrowly avoided flying golf balls and then over a disused railway by Far Popehill Spinney and on until we reached a road Bourton Hall to drop down to Bourton on Dunsmore and then turn right to Frankton passing a farm selling eggs with a sign warning that the premises were guarded by "Attack Chickens" We were lunching at the Friendly Inn in the village. This was a real highlight with super food, wonderful beer and a great welcome. A great pub and of course highly recommended!!

We left the pub and waked down the road to the church and then struck off left on field paths over hills with great views over to the reservoir and beyond then downhill to reach the magnificent old disused Birdingbury railway bridge. By now the rain had started up and we climbed up the road past the old mausoleum like church to reach the village but soon our footpath took us off left along the River Leam valley and back to a road where we continued along to Leamington Hastings. We had had enough by this stage

and Phillip by magnificent logistics planning left his car parked by the old stone church to ferry drivers back to Grandborough and then return to the village of Hill which is a mile or so down the road and to which the wery walkers trudged to be picked up and taken home for a well earned cuppa! This is a great walk and well worth the effort.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy walking. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the most of our beautiful local scenery.

Remember you don't have to do the full walk some of our members arrange pick ups from the pub stop halfway, normally 4 or 5 miles. Please call either Phillip on 01788891437 or Ray on 01788891384. We normally meet at 10 o'clock at the village hall but for those walks that entail a drive I will let you know meeting times. The plan for our next walk is as follows:
