Vicar's letter

'Nothing is impossible for God!'

These words were put in a letter from Revd Clive Cooper in response to the presentation our Church warden Peter Dickinson gave to the congregation on Sunday 4th July.

It was a presentation in Church showing the massive challenge ahead of us-raising money to preserve the fabric of our Church building which has serious structural problems. These words were re-iterated in the Gospel reading for last Sunday- when Mary is met by Angel Gabriel and told that the baby she is to bear will be the Son of God. To a teenage girl such a prospect must have been awesome- but 'nothing is impossible for God'! (Luke 1:37)

I have every confidence that in a few years time money will be raised for the Church. It does take faith to believe such a thing, but I base it on; My experience of Braunston- that here we are a community and we do pull together when there is a challenge ahead of us (think about how money has been raised for other buildings in the village)

My experience of our faithful God who acts- sometimes in the most unexpected ways- but whose nature is always 'merciful' and 'loving' (psalm 23: 6)

In response to this challenge a new 'Friends' steering group has been formed – which is made up of people who love our Church building. A group that includes Church, and non-Church goers – (we are at present looking for a treasurer!) All Saints will be launching a campaign to raise money for the Church and there are some fantastic ideas which will make the fund raising not only effective but dare I say it 'fun'! But if you don't want to wait and you would like to give a donation now that will be the best leaving present I could ever ask for! (Please make the cheque payable to 'Friends of All Saints' Church'!)

At the moment we are in the middle of our Holiday Club with Churches Together in Daventry. 110 children are meeting in the Methodist Church and the theme for this year is 'J Team'. It has been a week of noise, laughter, and working together to ensure the children are happy and hearing about how special they are to God. Volunteers from all the Churches help - all giving of their time, and talents. We are a team- and there are times when its hard work, and tiring, and we get irritable with each other. But the outcome-seeing Children flying through the doors in the morning eager for another day- makes the whole thing worthwhile. This initiative started a year after I arrived in the Daventry Team with 30 children- and it has grown and grown. No one would have thought 8 years ago we would be where we are today, but:

'Nothing is impossible for God.'

It is natural as I write that I am thinking beyond November when Braunston will be in interregnum. A lot will fall on the Daventry teamand on our Churchwardens Peter Dickinson and Ann Parker-Tyler, and for the team of the faithful congregation at All Saints'. Change is hard-but also necessary for growth and development. I have every confidence that whoever succeeds me will be a good Vicar- but the interregnum may go on for some time. In that time please support the Team at All Saints with your attendance, your prayers and hugs! (Also if you see something needs doing which you could help with- please offer your services!) And for the 'saints' at All Saints'; don't flag, pray constantly and see God come up trumps... For

'Nothing is impossible for God!' God Bless you, Revd Claire

JUMA's Story – Extracted from the latest thank you letter from H & H



Hope & Homes for Children

Juma spent his early years in the state of North Kordofan, Sudan, but he ran away from home because he felt he was a burden on his poverty stricken family.

Although aged nine and still a child, Juma spent years on his own and eventually ended up in Khartoum. The police detained Juma when they raided a market looking for street children and he was sent to live in a government centre. Here, he lived with over 300 children in appalling conditions for nearly three months.

We rescued Juma from the centre and he spent the next six years, until he was 18, in one of our Small Family Homes. He was reticent to talk about his traumatic childhood, Juma settled into the Home well and worked hard at school. However, Juma never forgot his family and often talked about his desire to find them again one day.

After a lot of painstaking detective work, our social workers made a huge breakthrough and located Juma's uncle.

Juma's uncle came to Khartoum and immediately recognized his nephew, After the uncle described the village Juma grew up in and talked about other members of his family, Juma could see that they were related. When Juma's uncle told him that his mother was looking for him he was overjoyed because he had convinced himself that she was dead.

In 2008 a social worker accompanied Juma and his uncle to Kasala town, where Juma's mother was living. Juma's reunion with his mother and sister was incredibly emotional and all of the community came out to welcome him home. Your support really means so much to us and, with your continued help; we can carry on working with more children like Juma and, for this, we are truly thankful.





Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 21.08.2010 Around Shutford (c.11 miles)

The weather forecast on TV was a bright blue for the midlands and we were fully prepared for a dousing as eight of us met up for the short drive to Shutford. All around the hills were wreathed in a fine rain and windscreen wipers were busy as we made our way to the start of the walk. As if on cue after we arrived the rain disappeared and we were off walking from beautiful old Shutford along a tree lined lane and then right in front of an old barn and downhill along a lane till we emerged into open fields with wheat awaiting harvest. This part of North Oxfordshire around the old village of Shutford is a beautiful area of rolling hills, dotted with interesting little stone villages. We continued over fields down to a valley bottom and what had once been an old mill serving the village of Shenington, our next destination. We approached the village via a rough track shown on the map as Mill Lane.

Just before the village we had to cross a barbed wire fence and an extremely muddy gate entrance that the cows had churned up. We tiptoed through the ankle deep mud and whatever else was in it and finally reached a T junction in the village.

Turning left we dropped downhill merrily sucking sweets supplied by Terry and turned left onto the Macmillan Way footpath that leads down through two beautiful valleys and past a huge chicken farm (the chickens were wandering at will so I guess that makes them free range) The Macmillan Way is a long distance path that goes from Linconshire all the way to Dorset and the bit we were on is also known as D'Arcy Dalton Way which is named after a Colonel who spent most of his life defending rights of way in Oxfordshire.

Our path climbed a field and then descended steeply down to the corner of the field to a stile and an old wooden bridge before crossing another field and arriving at a road near Rough Hill Farm. We crossed the road in sunshine and followed the footpath just below the imposing Yarn Hill on our left. During the recce Philip had struck out from here to reach the summit but we knew that the pub was getting closer and carried on the old path past inquisitive cows to enter the lovely old village of Epwell via somebody's garden. This is the correct path and we would never trespass being good walkers. Epwell (eoppa's well in Anglo Saxon) is a lovely old north Oxfordshire stone village and turning left in we came to the old village green which has a huge stone sundial sunk into the ground. If you put your walking stick in a hole provided you can get a reading and it was now nearly one o' clock, lunchtime. (If the sun is not out just look at your watch!) We crossed a ford washing our muddy boots and then walked up through the village to reach the old stone church which has a tower above the entrance and inside the old church there is a tapestry with about a hundred individual tapestries showing almost every stone cottage and house in the village. Well worth a look if you are down that way. Each one is a superb picture of the old buildings. Leaving the church through the old churchyard we turned up a footpath to reach a field which we crossed emerging in the back garden of The Chandlers Arms, a lovely old English unspoilt pub and we were soon ensconced over pints of foaming Old Hookey, brewed nearby at Hook Norton and eating wonderful sandwiches. Some unusual but delicious combinations such as bacon, Cheese and banana. Fantastic and the service was warm and friendly too. Obviously highly recommended.

Leaving the lovely old pub was a real wrench but we were soon underway again past Chillaway farm and onto a track that is an old Roman Road. The views on this stretch were magnificent over towards Swallcliffe and a a hill that is shown on the map as an ancient hill fort. Our path lead us back below the hill to Shutford where had a quick look at the old manor now owned by

the Cadbury family, the church and the pub all slap bang next to one another. They were cleaning the church but asked us to come in and soon Ray Hutchins, one of our new members, treated us to an impromptu concert on the church organ. A fantastic way to end a super walk. Thanks go to Alan Dent who lead this super ramble.

Come and join us on our regular monthly rambles, on the third Saturday in each month. We are an informal group of friends who enjoy country walks. The walks are not too strenuous, are a great way to have some healthy exercise, meet new friends, take in the occasional pub and make the best of our beautiful local scenery.
