The skeleton in the cupboard

I have been thinking about death rather a lot recently (Hello, my name is Sarah and I'm here to cheer you up!) We are surrounded by it in autumn. Despite the late burst of summery weather there is no denying that the days are shorter, the leaves are crinkling, and that the first frost will be along soon to kill the flowers and herald the winter. The first real ice will freeze the blood in the veins of small mammals in our hedgerows and vulnerable people will, as every winter, fall in greater numbers than usual into the care of the medics, undertakers and vicars. It is no coincidence that the pagan celebration of Halloween- now reduced to just a folky-jokey thing for children - and the ancient Christian feast of All Souls, when we light candles to remember our dead, are at this time of year. I hope that you don't think I am being crass and insensitive in mentioning this unpalatable business of death. Its part of what I do (and no, I do not mean that I am some sort of clerical assassin!) Generally speaking we prefer to avoid facing it until it rudely forces its way into our lives. The trouble is that then it comes as an awful shock and is not a bit ignorable, as any of you will know who have been very ill yourselves or paced the corridors of a hospital at night, or watched someone you love deteriorate into death or had a phone call bearing terrible news.

Over the past couple of weeks I have taken two Braunston funerals. Both of them were for people who ended their days surrounded by love. One was an ancient lady who had simply come to the end of a full and long life and the other was a luminous, vivacious person cheated of any sort of old age by the bastard cancer. Neither were church goers but both had great faith in God. I honestly believe that both are now at peace, restored to perfect health and joy, at one with the God they loved, for all eternity and that many of us will see them again. Both those ladies are now fine and we don't have to worry about them any more.

The worry is for those of us who are left behind. Whatever we may or may not believe we are not fine when someone we love dies. There are some well-meaning but pretty silly bereavement cards in the shops that say things like "death is nothing at all" If you are left without the love of your life, a family member or a lifelong friend you will know what nonsense that is. If you are awaiting death (particularly without faith) it does not feel remotely trivial. And if you have faith you will believe that you are taking a very important step into a new sort of life, but even then many people cannot leave this life without some regret unless they are exhausted by it. Death is a very big deal indeed and we should think and talk about it- not ghoulishly or morbidly but realistically and naturally as something that is part of all our lives.

So at this time of year with All Souls and autumn upon us- it is right to remember those we love who have left us but it is also right to face up to what will, one way or another, come to all of us. The great thing about this time of year (apart from soup, apple crumble, furry boots and bonfires) is that we know that it will pass and that come January the first snow-droppy signs of new life will be poking up through the snow in promise of glorious summer again. The same is true of death. It is to be suffered both by the victim and those left behind but without it there is no hope of heaven.

If you want a conversation about any of these things get in touch. I don't claim to have many of the answers but I might be some use in facing up to the questions. And you might want to admire my furry boots.

RUNNING SCARED' COMES BACK TO BRAUNSTON

The hunt for *Running Scared* is over! After almost forty years, the long-forgotten feature film shot in Braunston has been FOUND. And one of the film's stars is planning to come here to see it.

Braunston Cinema Club will show the film at a Gala Screening in the Village Hall on Sunday 4 December. Gayle Hunnicutt, who played the female lead, has accepted an invitation. It's hoped that the audience will be able to meet her and other guests afterwards.

Running Scared was the first film directed by the A-list actor David Hemmings, who had become a Sixties icon after *Blow Up.* It co-starred an up-and-coming Robert Powell (later to take the title role in *Jesus of Nazareth*) together with Gayle Hunnicutt, Hemmings' glamorous Texan wife.

The film crew more-or-less took over Braunston for the summer of 1971 and many residents took part as extras or became involved in other ways. It's still talked about and fondly remembered. The film was released the following year...and then disappeared completely.

The hunt for it has gone on for years, but gained fresh impetus last year thanks to the BVN. Abigail Campbell, from the village Cinema Club, appealed here for help to find a copy for the fortieth anniversary. As a direct result of that appeal it can now be screened again.

The story of the hunt has almost as many twists and turns as the film itself. It is told in full detail in a planned special souvenir programme to accompany the screening.

The search entailed more than 600 emails, letters and telephone calls. It covered the major film and television companies, surviving members of the cast and crew, the families of those who had died, academics, films clubs, hire companies, libraries and local authorities. It stretched over the UK, USA, Canada, France and Spain.

It was astonishing how many people responded. But none could help.

Then, late one January night, there was one more phone call to a film buff in America. "Yes, I've got that!" he said. Unbelievable elation! Followed by desperate disillusion. It was one of two other films also called Running Scared.

But he too was now bitten by the bug and began his own trawl in the USA. Months later he was back on line: he'd found it!

Even then it wasn't over. He had the film, but he did not have the copyright. And neither he nor anyone else knew who did. There was no point in bringing the film to Braunston if it could not be shown.

Legal opinion was sought. "Go ahead", said the experts – so long as you can show that you have made best efforts to find the copyright owner and have set aside the normal licence fee.

So that is what has been done. Details of all possible copyright owners contacted have been carefully logged. The film can finally be shown.

After forty years, the Running is over. The film has come home to Braunston.



The Dick Herne Braunston History Society

During the Second World War the Home Guard was very active in Braunston, many village people were involved and there are still residents who have memories of war time and 'Dad's Arrmy'. While the fictional Captain Mainwaring was busy at Warmington on sea, the Braunston Home Guard took their duties seriously with a look out post in the Church Tower and a fire engine behind the Old Dog and Gun to help them keep the village safe and deal with emergencies. The skies above Braunston could be quite busy, aircraft could be seen towing gliders such as Hengists, Horsas and Hamilcars. After re-fuelling it managed to take off after being stripped of all surplus equipment to reduce the weight. A bomb landed on the aqueduct at Puddlebanks and another in an adjacent field. Fortunately the Braunston Home Guard had practised for such an event during the previous weekend and was able to put in stop planks, thus preventing major flooding and further damage to the canal. 

Another highly recommend hostelry. Tearing ourselves away after lunch we past the old church and set off through the edge of the woods, through Fawsley, on legal paths, then took time to visit the old church and to see a beautiful bride having photos done at the lakes before crossing several fields to climb up to Preston Capes and back to the cars at Little Preston. 

The new 101 national police non-emergency number is being launched in Northamptonshire next week.

From next Monday (17 October), 101 will be the new number to contact Northamptonshire Police.

The 101 non-emergency number will provide you with a single, easy to remember number for you to call to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency police response.

You will be able to call 101 to report a crime that has already happened and any other incidents or concerns that do not require an emergency response. You can also call it to speak to your local Safer Community Team, to make a general enquiry or make us aware of any policing issues in your local area.

999 should still be used in an emergency, such as when a crime is happening, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, someone is injured, being threatened or a life is at risk, or there is a traffic incident involving personal injury or danger.

If you have any hearing difficulties or a speech impairment, a text phone will be available on 18001 101.

Calls to 101 from landlines and mobiles cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day you call or how long your call lasts.

101 is already in use in a number of areas across England and Wales and is being rolled out to the remaining police force areas on a phased basis over the next few months.

Our local number - 03000 111 222 - will remain available while 101 becomes established and for those calling from outside England and Wales, as well as for callers outside Northamptonshire where 101 is not yet live.
