New Vicar for Braunston







BRAUNSTON BUILDINGS

THE STOP HOUSE - BRAUNSTON



As you walk down the tow path after the Marina entrance you come upon a quite imposing building. This is the Stop House. It was built in 1796 by the Oxford Canal Company. This was 26 years after the Oxford Canal reached Braunston and 3 years after the opening of the Grand Junction Canal. This building was the main office on the Oxford Canal Company, the people working in the Stop House at this time would have been the Company Agent in his bowler hat, the

Toll Clerk and a Night Watchman. The small black trap door was used to pass the toll money as the canal men would not have been allowed inside. During the time of the original build the window tax was in existence and if one looks up at the top half of the hexagonal bay, the two side windows were originally brick walls. They were painted to look like windows. When the building was renovated in the 1990s the bricks were knocked out, sash windows added and the roof returned to its original state with slates.

The name Stop House comes from the Stop Lock which once stood outside the building. This lock was unusual as it was 80' long and 8' wide. Most locks at this time were 72' by 7'. All boats had to stop in the lock to be assessed for tolls. The Toll Clerk would measure the height of the boat above water from the gunwales at the front and back. He would then refer to a gauging book for that particular boat to calculate load, and then multiply it by the current charges for that type of cargo. Valuable cargoes like coal had much higher charges than for example gravel or horse manure! In the 1930s the canal was widened through Braunston which meant that one side of the Stop Lock was removed. It is still possible to see the remains of the other side of the lock opposite the Stop House.

Half way up on the left hand side the metal window frame of what is now the Reception Office can be seen a small hole. A length of cotton would be tied to a tree on the other side of the canal and passed through this hole where it would ring a bell when leant upon. This was to warn the Toll Keeper of boatmen who tried to avoid paying taxes by muffling the horse's hooves as they went by in the dead of night!

At the side of the Stop House is a brick building, which was the original stable and hay loft above.

In 1814 it is reported that Charles Dickens called at the Stop House to send a post-card.

Local resident Mandy Cook's father was a Lengthman for British Waterways. The family lived in the Stop House from 1982 to 1989. Mandy remembers clearly the 4 cellars in the Stop House. The first one had a huge inglenook fireplace with a range and copper boiler with room for a fire beneath. The second cellar had a number of hooks in the ceiling and a drainage channel used for slaughtering. Luckily there was a plug in the channel as Mandy kept food for her pony here and came down one day to find that the water level in the canal had risen and the cellars were flooding. Once the plug was removed the water returned to normal!

JETTY FIELD UPDATE

300 plants The team, mostly Andrew and Dennis, have between them planted over 300 items in Jetty Field. All the hedges in the Garden Area have been completed and gaps filled in. Hedges on the west of the field have been established and a beginning made to replacing the hedge below the allotments. And less obvious but vital work has continued in reseeding the field with plants that were recorded in Duncan Gallie's Village Flora survey in the 50s. There has also been some planting in the Gallie Wildlife area, not to change its use and value to the birds and bees, but to begin to thin out the bigger weed trees [eventually] and establish a more varied pattern of vegetation.

26 sheep We are half way through the winter grazing and already the value of these animals cropping the grass can be seen. They nibble deep down and cut the grass and plants with their teeth - a different process to the mechanical slicing of a mower. A big thank you to all who have accepted their presence and made the necessary adaptations to assist them. We are delighted at the efforts that are being made to care for them. And it is good to think that the field is in productive use and making its proper contribution in an agricultural setting.

7 small leaved lime trees Several lime trees have been donated to the park to finish off the avenue of limes running diagonally across the field. These are from a legacy of Louise Stuart and in her memory. Temporary guards are provided and these will be replaced in due course by larger enclosures to match the existing units.

5000 pruned branches The next big volunteer job involves dragging bundles of brushwood towards central points where they can be chipped with a large bore machine for use as path surfacing in the Spinney area. This should be quite fun and you would be welcome to join us by mentioning your interest to Carol Barnes in the Boatshop. It is necessary to register as a volunteer to be included in Parish Council insurance - working both ways of course.

The building work at the Village Hall is ahead of schedule! Despite the recent bad weather Martyn and his team have actually pulled forward one week. Unless there is another run of bad weather they are quietly confident of

hitting the target date of March 31st.

The Braunston Village Gardens Association (BVGA) is already looking at plans for the garden area when the builders move out. Richard Dibben is joining the Village Hall Committee as BVGA representative. 



The rain was battering my bedroom window when I woke up on this Saturday. The forecast had been for rain at first and clearing up as the morning went on. Isn't it funny how we believe, implicitly in the forecast when it says the weather will improve but we discount the forecast when they say it will deteriorate? Anyway this walk takes in our lovely neighbouring village of Ashby St Ledgers and the footpath runs, as near as damn it, along the hard shoulder of the roaring, busy M1 before crossing the old rail tunnel to get to Kilsby for lunch in one of the best pubs around, The George. There is a lot of historical interest and the theme for this walk is Father and Son as will become clear.

So with rain still falling, I was amazed that we had a turn out of 14 people as we set off up along the Ashby Road and then straight on up the bridle way out of the village and steadily uphill. This is a good place for views across the village normally but this morning all we could see were clouds! We reached the Barby road, crossed it and took a field path to meet the A361 and the road into Ashby St Ledgers. Opposite the pub here is a beautiful thatched cottage designed, along with the village war memorial, by Sir Edwin Landseer Luytens the architect. He designed the India Gate, that huge arch in Delhi as well as many of the other buildings there and, closer to home, the Cenotaph in Whitehall. His father was the great landscape painter Landseer whose paintings of magnificent stags with Scottish mountain backgrounds we have all seen. What a talented family!

We passed the huge Ashby Manor with its links to the gunpowder plot and took the road out of the village and down to a dip in the road shown as a ford on the ordnance survey map. We paused here to eat Terry's sweets which were, as always, much appreciated. Continuing along the road we crossed the railway bridge and arrived at a T junction on the A5. Turning left the rain had by now stopped just as forecast and we crossed the busy road and followed another small road towards Crick. In front of us was the M1 and our footpath turned off the road and ran alongside the thundering motorway. Not ideal but after a quarter of a mile the path started to veer left alongside the railway and away from the noisy road. After a mile or so we turned left and went under the railway to cross several fields and over the railway tunnel at Kilsby.

The tunnel was opened in 1838 and took Robert Stephenson (son of George Stephenson who built the Rocket locomotive) 3 years to build it due to problems with quicksand. Which also pushed up the price from the £99000 estimate up to £320,000 (over £23 million in todays money) Yet another talented family! Robert Stephenson had lived in Kilsby and our walk home took us past his old house which has a small scale model of the tunnel entrance in the front garden.

The George pub is said to be built from the same bricks as used in the tunnel. It really is a magnificent pub and we were made very welcome and the food and London Pride beer was excellent. The chips really are superb!! This has always been one of our favourite pubs and it never disappoints. Fantastic!

We left the pub reluctantly and pulling on wet and muddy boots we took a path out of Kilsby over to Barby emerging at the back of the village before walking up to the water tower and turning right down Longdown Lane. The footpath turns off left after the cricket ground and then drops down over several fields with Braunston and the church

in the distance. We walked along below Tiltups Farm and over more fields to come out at the bottom of Countryside before wending our way home for a cuppa. This really is a great walk and super pub! Well worth the effort!!
