


Those of us who know Lystra and Peter will really miss them as will all at All Saints'. There is a tinge of envy as we wish them Bon Voyage and every success for the future.

### PAST TIMES

It was more than 40 years ago, in 1970 that the Braunston Village News was first published.

Duncan Gallie, retired head teacher in the village school was the editor. He included a section called "Village Notes" based on natural history. Following his death in 1990 the main contributors to "Village Notes" were Dick Herne on historical topics and Frank Cox on gardening. I thought it would be interesting to republish some of these and other items from back issues of the magazine in this and future issues of BVN.

### June 1980

Most English people love to own and cultivate a garden. We should remember with gratitude our predecessors who, by patient work selected wild flowers, and by cross pollination developed the brightly coloured flowers which today adorn our gardens. The cowslip - a member of the primrose family, has been developed to give us the Primula.

Several of our fruit trees were originally brought from abroad by soldiers of the roman garrisons 18 or 19 centuries ago. Enlisted from different provinces of an Empire which stretched from the Atlantic Ocean to the Euphrates, these men tried to re-create the gardens of their homelands by importing a wide variety of plants. Probably many plants would not grow in our colder climate, but some fruit trees were introduced this way. We imported the potato, runner bean, sweet corn, tomato and pumpkin from South America. All of these vegetables and many others had been cultivated by the Incas centuries before the Spanish Conquistadores destroyed a civilisation which in their blind hatred and greed they were too ignorant to understand. ### October 1990

The 'Old Road' which joins the A45 opposite the Marina was part of the 'West Chester@ road leading to Holyhead and the crossing to Ireland. In the 18th century the Royal Mail and stage coaches, heavy commercial wagons and riders on horseback all used this track. The road between Daventry and Dunchurch was 'turnpiked' in 1720 that is taken over by a company which erected gates and charged tolls to pay for maintenance which was often neglected. The house at the foot of the Old Road was once the 'Bird in Hand' Inn and beyond it the road turned sharply into the valley. It ran over the old millstream which flowed across Berryfields to join the Leam. Then past the 'Old Castle' Inn, now a guests house and continued to Dunchurch Beyond this travellers had to face crossing Dunsmore Heath, a haunt of footpads and highwaymen.



# CANAL MAINTENANCE

# Winter 2010/11 - Maintenance work at Braunston Locks



Two new bottom end lock gates have been fitted to lock 1 this winter, included in this work was the installation of a new anchor block for each gate. These blocks consist of steel beams (previously timber) attached within the anchor block and run under the quadrants en-cased in concrete to considerable depth. Horn bolts are located within the anchor to which the collar around the heel of the gate is attached. This whole system is basically the fix which keeps the gate in position. The bricks to the quadrant are then re-laid over the concrete, returning the site to its previous outlook.

Lock 5 also has new anchors installed to the existing gates to re-stabilize - including a new cill

bumper at the top end. This bumper is a very large timber re-cessed into the lock walls either side and takes the impact from boats as they enter the lock going uphill.

Lower sets of gates seem to suffer the most and new bottom gates will save water even if the top gates are becoming worn and leaking. They are only replaced after all attempts to repair or adjust have been tried and a life somewhere in the region of 20 years is expected even on a busy flight like Braunston. The new gates are made by BW in their workshop at Stanley Ferry, nr, Wakefield in West Yorkshire. The final adjustments for fit and sealing take place on site



during installation. These gates are oak but there are a few all steel gates on the system and at lock 2 Hillmorton both ends of the lock have original cast-iron. The gates are delivered with the beams separate and can have the paddle gear and gate paddles already installed unless heritage states otherwise and the original will be re-used. The pictures show the extent of brickwork etc that is not normally visible in the locks also the water drain and return points linked to the ground paddles. Seeing the quality of workmanship achieved all those years ago without all the mechanical aids available today is quite an eye opener. That the same methods are still basically used today shows the quality and foresight of the design.



### Ruin to Ancient Monument

If you follow the track through the gated road from the A45 and opposite the bus stop where the road crosses the canal at Braunston you will eventually come to the beautiful old Church of St Peter's Wofhamcote. The Domesday Book records that there has been a church on this site but the current church (following many alterations and additions) was rebuilt in the 14 century. Due to the decline in population the Church was often unused and finally closed after the war. There was a lot of

vandalism at the time and the 'Friends' of St Peter's maintained it as well as possible. Eventually the Church was declared redundant by The Pastoral Measure of 1968. The Redundant Churches Fund took over the maintenance of the Church and a schedule of repairs was carried out over the next few years. The Church is now a unique and beautiful space owned by



the Churches' Conservation Trust, (CCT). Visitors come to the Ancient Monument. We would like this space to be used for Arts events locally. It seems to be an ideal space for this and it will support its future with the CCT. We want to cherish the building and what it stands for over the centuries.

We have developed a website which hosts the videos we have made for school use -"All History is Here". It will also contain records and reports from the history of the parish. We are bidding for funding from Arts on Our Doorstop. This will be to showcase the Church and area further on the website and to put on Arts events. The first event will be on June 25th, Warwick Folk Festival will include us in their Folk Dance Festival, bringing 50 dancers. We will combine this with a CCT Tea party. We ask for your support.



# Braunston Walkers - Walk Saturday 19/3/11 Litchborough, Maidford and Blakesley (c.9 miles)

With blazing spring sunshine and not a cloud in sight eleven of us set off on this walk in a new area for us that takes three lovely old villages and some stunning scenery as well!

After a drive to Litchborough we walked along the high street past the imposing old stone Litchborough House to turn right along Kiln Lane to join the grassy Knightley Way, a twelve mile path from Badby to Greens Norton. Our path went off left and crossed fields to reach the Litchborough Road where we turned right and soon reached a fingerpost pointing left towards Maidford. Some wag had turned this 180 degrees and in the recce we had nearly gone wrong here but luckily Philip had spotted the error and we had fixed the sign (strange really as I was the one with the map at the time, but maybe that says it all!) We crossed fields past some increasingly inquisitive highland cattle before reaching Maidford and its small mid 12th century church. It is unusual and has a pitched roof on top of its square tower. The wooden pews inside are dated 1879, a Victorian addition. Nigel stood in for Terry and offered us mints before we crossed a road and then took another road before reaching a field path that crosses what must have been some kind of quarry. Now it is green meadow land with strange humps and bumps and full of bleating sheep and newborn lambs always a lovely sight but improved with the sunshine. After crossing the Litchborough road again our footpath traversed several fields and on the left an old track leading up to disused quarries according to the OS map. We reached a narrow meandering river and the site of an old Fulling Mill mentioned on the map. Fulling also called Tucking was apparently a process of cleaning wool of oil and dirt to make it thicker as part of the cloth making process. Before the fulling mill medieval people used to do this using their feet. Not unlike wine making but without the resultant product! The mill was where wool was stretched on frames called tenters and then pounded. That's where the phrase "on tenter hooks" originates. Fullers Earth which you may of heard of, comes from the vale of the white horse in Oxfordshire, and was a soft clay used to absorb lanolin and oils in clothmaking. This is turning into an episode of Stephen Fry's Ql isn't it?

Back to the walk we crossed a road and followed the path over a disused railway which used to be the Stratford on Avon and Midland Junction railway. Philip selected a hazel stick and using Alan's hastily produced penknife created a great walking stick for Jane. Our path lead to the hamlet of Woodend and we turned left here to walk along the road and down into Blakesley. The road soon reached a bridge over the old railway and on our right the old station. Over to our left is parkland that was once Blakesley Hall, then home of Charles Bartholemew who was lucky enough to have a miniature railway (now sadly, and like the main railway, no longer there) to take him from the station to his house (now sadly demolished) and to have a pub "The Bartholemew Arms" named after him, where we had an excellent, great value lunch. As the pub was not officially opened till 26/3 we had been a little concerned that it would not meet our standards but it was super and highly recommended!! The Brakespear Ale was one of the very best.


After lunch we walked through the quaint old stone village and our path turned right off

the road shortly after the church and crossed two fields then in the third field we branched off left and soon reached the Banbury Lane. Crossing this road our path followed a river behind Seawell Valley House on our left then past Tivy Farm to again reach the Litchborough Road which we crossed before coming back into Litchborough along a magnificent avenue of trees which leads to Litchborough House, still bathed in sunshine, and the village where we had left the cars for the drive back. A great walk through some of our lesser known Northants villages.
