Why we need Christmas?

The world is a weird and often upsetting place. It seems as if the sneaky, the dishonest and the downright nasty among us get away with doing enormously awful things while decent hardworking people end up suffering consequences and penalties that seem disproportionate to anything they might appear to deserve. This feels particularly true at present for the church community at Ashby St Ledgers. I walked in to the 800 year old church on a wet day recently and discovered to my horror that I could see sky through the ceiling and that moreover the said sky was chucking biblical quantities of rain into the church. Some "Brood of Vipers (to use a suitably scriptural epithet) had been and removed the lead from the roof, presumably to sell for a pittance, leaving considerable damage, cost, anxiety and demoralisation in their wake. I'm furious- not just at the physical damage but because the little band of worshippers at Ashby work very hard to keep that little church in order and they do not deserve what has happened. My instinct is to put big notices on the roof in case the culprits return for the few remaining scraps of lead saying "Abandon Hope all ye who enter here" or "Have you ever heard of Hell?" but I suspect that CCTV and roof alarms will be the real deterrents! But my instinct is not wrong in the great scheme of things even if I do express it rabidly and medievally for literary effect!

Before we get to Christmas we meet four weeks of Advent or preparation. Four weeks when we recognise our own awfulness and try to put it right before the angels burst into the world with news of redemption. Christmas is about the dawning of a new kind of age of justice, bigger than human justice, where the innocent will be vindicated and those who harm others, do awful things, steal lead from church roofs, and don't mend their ways will encounter eternal consequences. Justice will ultimately be done. That is a big part of the Christmas message. So if you are someone who has a rough deal at the hands of others, Happy Christmas! If you are someone who does nasty things, have a good look at yourself this Advent and change your ways! And then have a post-repentence Happy Christmas!

Whatever and whoever you are (and most of us, including me are a murky mixture of both good and bad) I shall hope to see you as we celebrate the age old story of hope, peace and justice together this month!

BRAUNSTON WALKERS

Braunston Kilsby Barby (c.10 miles)

A sparkling, cold and brilliantly sunny day greeted us for the walk as thirteen of us met up at the village hall for a romp over to Kilsby. Recently the weather had been cloudy and wet and in the recce we had electric fences sparking in the mist and at one point a belt from the fence that threw me and my stick a yard or so. It was as if the farmer was sitting in a farm house plugging the fence into the mains as we approached "got another walker!" he maybe chuckled. But I digress we walked out of the village up the Ashby Road and started to walk along the narrow track over fields and uphill to reach the Barby Road. The views back over Braunston and the Warwickshire plain from here are magnificent. There is a small locked shed at the top of the last field which is an old well apparently found when the farmer asked a water diviner to find water and he suggested that if they dig down 30 foot in that spot they would strike water. It was actually 29 foot but still an impressive feat by the diviner using a forked twig. We crossed the road and took the field path towards Ashby St Ledgers but turned left before reaching the A361 which runs from Kilsby all the way to Ilfracombe and is the longest '3-digit' road in Britain. We followed path boundaries past a non existant "Cocked Hat Spinney" clearly still shown on the map but long since ploughed into the soil. We paused to enjoy Nigel's pear drops and Terry's Glacier Mints and continued past two, small, tree lined ponds and into the grounds of an old manor house which is no longer standing. The surrounding estate was acquired by the Crown Estates and is now used for shooting and private fishing. Pheasants and Partridges bolted from cover as we approached. We walked along the footpath through a colourful autumnal forest behind the big lake which is a magnificent sight glinting in the sun. My run in with the National Grid happened at the end of this path and rather than fry the remaining Braunston Walkers we took a short detour to emerge on the Ridgeway road. The footpath leads off the road, over several fields and then on a narrow bridge over the M45 into Kilsby itself. We turned right along a small cul de sac and left at a T junction before taking a tree lined path to emerge on the village green. We then crossed the road and walked along Manor Road and entered Church Lane which emerges, not surprisingly, at the old stone church but more importantly past the tiny Old School House to reach The George pub. This is one of our favourite watering holes (the only pub where we have always been thanked for taking off our muddy boots) and this time it was again an absolute winner. The beer, Adnams was delicious as was the food with excellent crusty baquettes and fresh, beautifully dressed salad. Not rocket science but often pubs serve a bit of limp old dry lettuce. The lady at The George is always polite and so well organised. The main meals also looked and tasted very good and were reasonably priced so it is highly recommended.

We dragged ourselves away and walked through Kilsby to pass the house where Robert Stephenson lived and built the Kilsby rail tunnel. A model of the

tunnel entrance stands in his front garden. We walked out of the village and took a footpath over fields which goes underneath the M45 and emerges on fields leading towards Barby. We trudged over more fields finally reaching the Ridgeway. We crossed the road and joined a concrete pathway past Chapel Farm which 150 years ago was the home of Dr Thomas Arnold, the headmaster of Rugby School, before taking the Barby Road back to the village and home for a welcoming cuppa! A great walk and very close to home..

Come and join us on our next walks. We meet at 10 at the village hall and our next walks are as follows: - 24th November Everdon Woods (c.10 miles) 15th December Christmas Walk (c.6 miles)

Down at the den.

Braunston Scouts continued their winning run by coming in first in the Star Trek competition. We also enjoyed a family day out at Chessington which was given over to Scouts and Guides for the day - you have never seem so many woggles in one place. Some of us were even, as the motto goes, prepared, and took coats as just as we arrived so did the tail end of the hurricane. We gave up trying to stay dry and went on all of the rides including the log flume as by then we were saturated. I am not sure that we have all dried out yet!

Some of us went on a weekend camp recently to The Oaks campsite in Leicestershire. There were many activities for us to try with air rifle shooting, climbing, abseiling and mountain boarding top of the list. For once on a camp it didn't rain and we didn't bring home any stowaways this time. I wonder how the mouse from Cannock is getting on?

Thank you to all the villagers and beyond who bought the cakes from our stall. Also thanks to all those who donated cakes for us to sell. Thank you also to Jed for his recent donation. It all helps to keep us going and give us a Scout Troop to be proud of.
